Science in the Park also features groups that promote health and safety in the community, such as Tiburcio Vasquez, La Familia Counseling Service, California Highway Patrol, the Alameda County Sheriff's Office, and the Hayward Police Department. Food Truck Mafia and Dig Deep Farms will also be in attendance.
