## Routine Medical Care

- History includes ingestion of phenothiazines
- → Chlorpromazine (Thorazine, Largactil)
- → Promazine (Compazine)
- → Triflupromazine (Vesprin)
- Signs and Symptoms: often mistaken for a seizure disorder or tetany
- → Agitated/frightened appearance
- → Small pupils
- → Hypotension
- → Facial grimaces
- → Protruding tongue

- → Levomepromazine (Nozinan)
- → Piperidines (Haloperidol, Risperidone)
- → Promethazine (Phenergan)
- → Jaw muscle spasm
- → Oculogyric crisis (circular movement of the eyeballs)
- → Torticollis (twisting of the neck)
- → Spasms of the back muscles, causing the head
- → and legs to bend backward and the trunk to arch up
