PSYCHIATRIC EVALUATION - 5150 TRANSPORTS

 GENERAL INFORMATION: Any patient who has been (or will be) placed on a 5150 hold for psychiatric evaluation shall be transported according to this policy

2. MEDICAL CLEARANCE CRITERIA:

- 2.1 Patients "in extremis" (those with a potential life-threatening illness or injury) should be transported to the closest most appropriate receiving hospital for the medical needs of the patient
- 2.2 For all other patients, to determine if medical clearance is required, answer the following questions:
 - ► Is there a medical or traumatic reason why this patient should not be transported to an emergency psychiatric facility?
 - ▶ Is the patient unconscious or unresponsive?
 - ▶ Is the patient pale, sweaty, dizzy, or showing signs of shock?
 - ▶ Does the patient have chest pain?
 - ▶ Does the patient have abdominal pain?
 - ▶ Does the patient have significant bleeding from trauma?
 - ▶ Is the patient significantly intoxicated or overdosed on drugs and unable to ambulate?
 - ▶ Do you suspect the patient may have taken an overdose of medication?
 - ▶ Is the patient > 65 years old showing an abrupt change in behavior or cognition?

3. DESTINATION:

- 3.1 <u>Medical Clearance:</u> If the answer to <u>ANY</u> question in # 2.2 is "YES", the patient requires medical clearance and should be transported as follows:
 - 3.1.1 **Adolescents** (age 12 through 17) Closest most appropriate Alameda County receiving hospital
 - 3.1.2 Adults Closest most appropriate Alameda County receiving hospital
 - 3.1.3 Children (age 11 and under) Children's Hospital, Oakland
- 3.2 <u>Psychiatric Evaluation:</u> If the answer to <u>ALL</u> questions in # 2.2 is "NO", the patient does not require medical clearance and should be transported to one of the following emergency psychiatric facilities:
 - 3.2.1 **Adolescents** (age 12 through 17) Willow Rock Center, San Leandro. Notify Willow Rock en route at 895-5502
 - 3.2.2 Adults John George Pavilion, San Leandro
 - 3.2.3 **Children** (age 11 and under) Children's Hospital
- 3.3 Note: Ambulance Diversion If a hospital is on ambulance diversion, 5150 patients requiring medical clearance should be diverted to the next closest facility unless the patient has a life threatening medical condition or meets any of the exceptions listed in the Ambulance Diversion Policy page v
