SUBJECT: APPROVE A MONETARY CONTRIBUTION TO SUPPORT THE ALAMEDA COUNTY'S VIOLENCE PREVENTION INITIATIVE

Dear Board Members:

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**:

- A. Authorize a monetary contribution to support the Alameda County's Violence Prevention Initiative in the amount of \$30,000, from the Probation Department General Fund; and
- B. Authorize the Auditor-Controller Office to make the related budgetary adjustments.

#### DISCUSSION/SUMMARY/FINDING:

The Alameda County Probation Department Workforce Development Program developed by the Beautification Council will support the Alameda County Violence Prevention Blueprint *Objective #3: Foster Safe and Vibrant Neighborhoods* through prioritizing the hiring of justice-involved clients. This program consists of workforce training, skillset development, and job creation, employing our curbside community with stipends equivalent to \$17.19 per hour for 6 hours per day. Because of illegal dumping, and its counterparts are fluid conditions, the amount of work and locations change from day to day; however, the process implemented by the Beautification Council remains constant, providing valuable life skills, training, and empowerment to the County's most vulnerable population.

The following are the program's objectives.

- Economically stabilize and empower our vulnerable population with training to provide opportunities to earn stipend pay, equivalent to \$17.19 per hour.
- Abate and deter illegal dumping and the accompanying blight that causes public health and safety issues.

- Increase the County's workforce through employing unsheltered, curbside, hard to employ, and/or re-entry populations with paid job training through stipends.
- Prioritizing the hiring of justice-involved clients through skillset training and job placement, at the same time mitigating the spread of COVID-19 by removing public health and safety hazards that otherwise would remain infectious and unsanitary.

The Probation Department is contributing \$30,000 from general fund to support this effort.

#### **FINANCING**:

Funding for this initiative is included in the ACPD's FY 2020/21 adjusted budget. There is no increase in net County cost as a result of approving the above recommendations.

### **VISION 2026 GOAL**:

The contribution to the Violence Prevention Initiative meets the 10x goal pathways of <u>Crime Free County</u> in support of our shared vision of <u>Safe and Livable Communities</u>.
