Approval "In Principle" of Agreement to Evaluate the School-Based Health Centers

(SBHC) and the Full Service Community Schools & Neighborhoods Initiative

RECOMMENDATION:

- Approve in principle the agreement with the University of California, San Francisco (Principal: Andrew Boulter, Associate Director of Contracts and Grants) for the period July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010, in the amount of \$356,992 for the evaluation of the School-Based Health Centers and the Full Service Community Schools & Neighborhoods Initiative.
- 2. Authorize the Acting Director, Health Care Services Agency, to execute the agreement and submit originals to the Clerk of the Board for filing.
- 3. Approve the attached financial recommendation:

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION/FINDINGS

Since 1998, your Board has approved annual agreements with the University of California, San Francisco's (UCSF) Institute for Health Policy Studies (IHPS) to develop an ongoing evaluation of the Alameda County School-Based Health Centers. Their evaluation program design along with our unique Alameda County School-Based Health Center Coalition has helped to place Alameda County as a national model of health care service delivery for school-age youth.

On February 24, 2009, your Board approved and accepted funding from The California Endowment and The Kaiser Permanente Northern California Fund for Community Benefit for the implementation of the Alameda County Full Service Community Schools & Neighborhood and Oakland Universal Health Access Initiatives to strengthen city/regional infrastructure through strategic planning and bridge building between health, education, and communities in 4 regions in Alameda County (San Lorenzo, Hayward, Fremont and TriValley) and establish up to 10 new school-based health centers (SBHCs) in Oakland over the next 4 years.

SELECTION PROCESS:

In 1997, the Alameda County School-Based Health Center Program reviewed research institutions with expertise in adolescent health and program evaluation. The University of California, San Francisco was and remains the only nationally-recognized program in the San Francisco Bay Area. Claire Brindis, DrPH, principal investigator of the Evaluation is also Director of the Center for

Reproductive Health Policy Research and Professor of Pediatrics and Health Policy at the Institute for Health Policy Studies, University of California, San Francisco. She has conducted numerous evaluation projects in the area of school-based health centers, adolescent pregnancy prevention, and women's health. She wrote a manual on the evaluation of school-based health centers and a monograph on potential funding streams to support SBHCs in California. Dr. Brindis Is also a Charter Member of the National Assembly on School-Based Health Care.

FINANCING:

Financing for this contract comes from Tobacco Master Settlement and Measure A funding that have been incorporated in the FY 2009-2010 budget approved by your Board for Health Care Services Agency Finance (Orgs. #350121 and #350161) in the amount of \$194.329. Approval of the attached financial recommendation in the amount of \$162,663 reflects funding from the Kaiser Permanente Northern California Fund for Community Benefit and the California Endowment and is required to implement the attached Standard Agreement. There is no impact on County General Fund revenue.
