SALARY FOR JOB CODE ("JC") 0495 AND UPDATE REP UNIT FOR JC 2219) AND 2) MEMORANDUM

OF UNDERSTANDING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT FOR ACCRETION OF JC 2219

Dear Board Members:

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Adopt a Salary Ordinance amendment to update Article 1, Section 1-1 (Pay Rate Schedules), subsection 1-1.1, to: i) correct the salary for the classification of Supervisor's Assistant (Job Code ("JC") 0495) retroactive to May 12, 2024, and ii) update the Representation Unit for the classification of Program Manager, Detention Facilities (JC 2219) from U15 to R30 effective August 18, 2024.
- Adopt an Ordinance amending the November 13, 2022, through November 22, 2025, Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") between the International Federation of Professional and Technical Engineers, Local 21, AFL-CIO Civil Engineers Management Unit ("CEMU") and County of Alameda ("County") to add the classification of Program Manager, Detention Facilities (JC 2219) in Representation Unit R30 effective August 18, 2024.

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

On April 16, 2024, your Board approved to increase the salary for the Supervisor's Assistant (JC 0495) classification, along with other Unrepresented M-designated and non-management related management classifications by six percent (6%) effective May 12, 2024. Subsequently, on June 4, 2024, staff recommended and your Board approved to increase the minimum salary rate for the classification of Supervisor's Assistant (JC 0495), exempt from the Fair Labor Standards Act ("FLSA") to \$32.00 to meet the salary threshold test of twice the State of California ("State") minimum wage standard retroactive to January 1, 2024. To apply the six percent (6%) increase correctly for the minimum salary rate for said classification, it should be based on the minimum salary rate of \$32.00. As such, staff recommends correcting the minimum hourly salary rate of the Supervisor's Assistant classification (JC 0495) from \$32.00 to \$33.92 (or \$2713.60 biweekly) retroactive to May 12, 2024.

In addition, on June 5, 2024, the Human Resource Services Department ("HRS") received an accretion authorization petition (petition for union representation) from the incumbent in the single-position classification of Program Manager, Detention Facilities (JC 2219) for representation by CEMU. Staff evaluated said petition, and on June 12, 2024, notified the incumbent and CEMU that said classification is appropriate for representation by CEMU (Representation Unit R30), and that if they wished to be placed into a different representation unit, to contact staff within 10 days of the date of the notice. Staff did not receive a response, and on June 24, 2024, notified CEMU confirming a recommendation will be made to your Board. As such, staff recommends amending the November 13, 2022, through November 22, 2025, MOU between CEMU and the County to include the classification of Program Manager, Detention Facilities (JC 2219)

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in Representation Unit R30 effective August 18, 2024, and the Salary Ordinance subsection 1-1.1 by updating the Representation Unit from U15 to R30 effective the same date.
