II. Alameda County Housing Element (2015-2023)

Liz McElligott, Assistant Agency Director, Community Development Agency presented a memorandum to update the Committee on the Alameda County Housing Element for 2015 thru 2023.

State law requires each city and county to adopt a General Plan containing at least seven elements, including a Housing Element. Unlike the other mandatory General Plan elements, a Housing Element must be updated every eight years, and is subject to detailed statutory requirements and mandatory review by the State Department of Housing and Community Development (State HCD). 2016.

The document must outline local housing needs, the barriers or constraints to providing housing, and actions proposed to address those concerns over a designated planning period. The State of California allocates, through local Councils of Government, each locality's share of the Regional Housing Needs Allocation, which the jurisdiction is to plan for in the development of the Housing Element.

The Housing Element has been presented at Unincorporated Services Committee and the Planning Commission.

The staff is requesting feedback on the proposed General Plan Amendment. With the Committee's recommendation, staff anticipates that the matter will be presented before the full Board at the May 5, 2015 Board Planning Meeting.
