Off-Farm Labor Housing Loans and Grants

What does this program do?

USDA Rural Development
provides low interest loans and
grants to eligible borrowers to
develop or rehabilitate affordable
rental housing for very-low, lowor moderate-income domestic,
migrant, and seasonal farm
laborers. Borrowers must
not otherwise be able to get
commercial credit.

Program Features

Funding

Announced annually through a Notice of Solicitation of Applications (NOSA) placed in the Federal Register.

Grant Amount

Grants are available only to nonprofit entities and can fund up to 90 percent of the project cost.

Loan Amount

The maximum loan amount is indicated in the *Federal Register* NOSA.

Interest Rate

The interest rate is 1 percent per annum.

Loan Term

33 years

Rental Assistance

Rental Assistance (RA) and Operating Assistance (OA) information appears in the annual NOSA.

Who can apply for this program?

- Broad-based nonprofit organizations
- Nonprofit organization of farmworkers
- Federally recognized Indian Tribes
- · Community organizations
- States or local governments

 Limited partnerships with a nonprofit general partner. Must meet 7 CFR 3560.55(d) requirements (available at this link: https://go.usa.gov/xMfCp)

Eligible Tenants

- Includes domestic farm laborers, individuals who earn a substantial portion of their income from farm labor and their families, retired farm laborers and their families, or disabled farm laborers and their families.
- Occupants must be U.S. citizens, permanent residents, or those legally admitted to this country and authorized to perform work in agriculture.
- Income eligibility is based on household size, and ranges from very-low to moderate-income.
