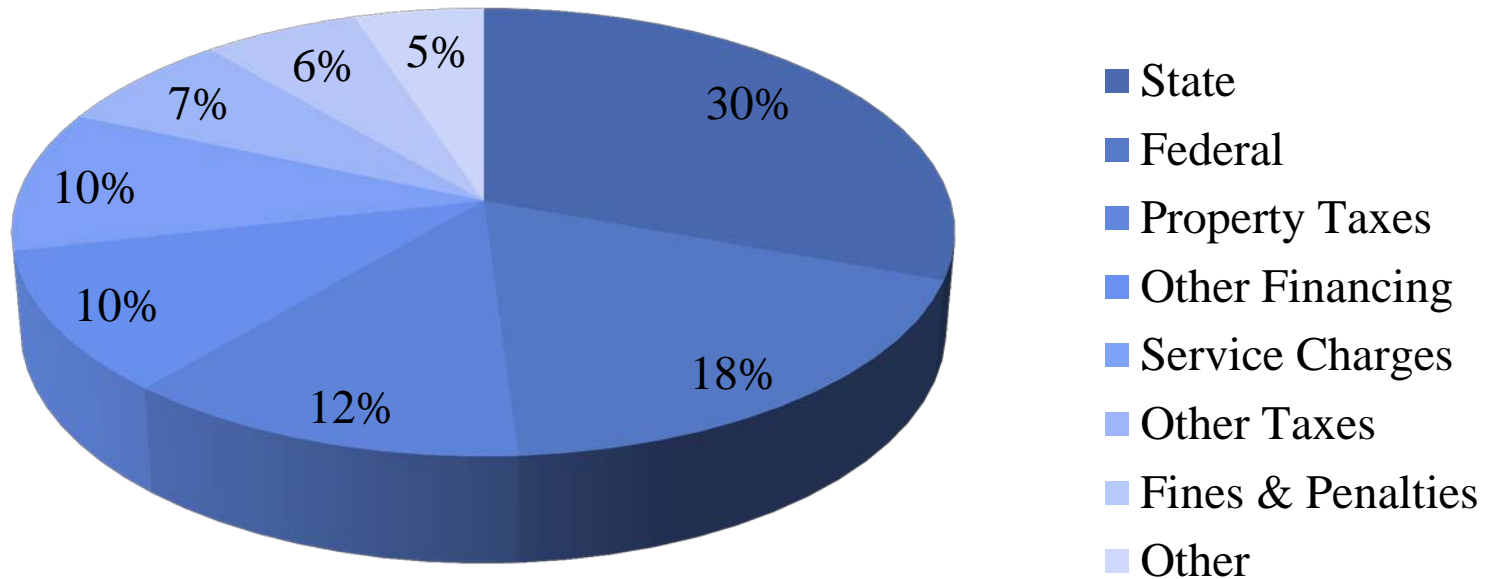

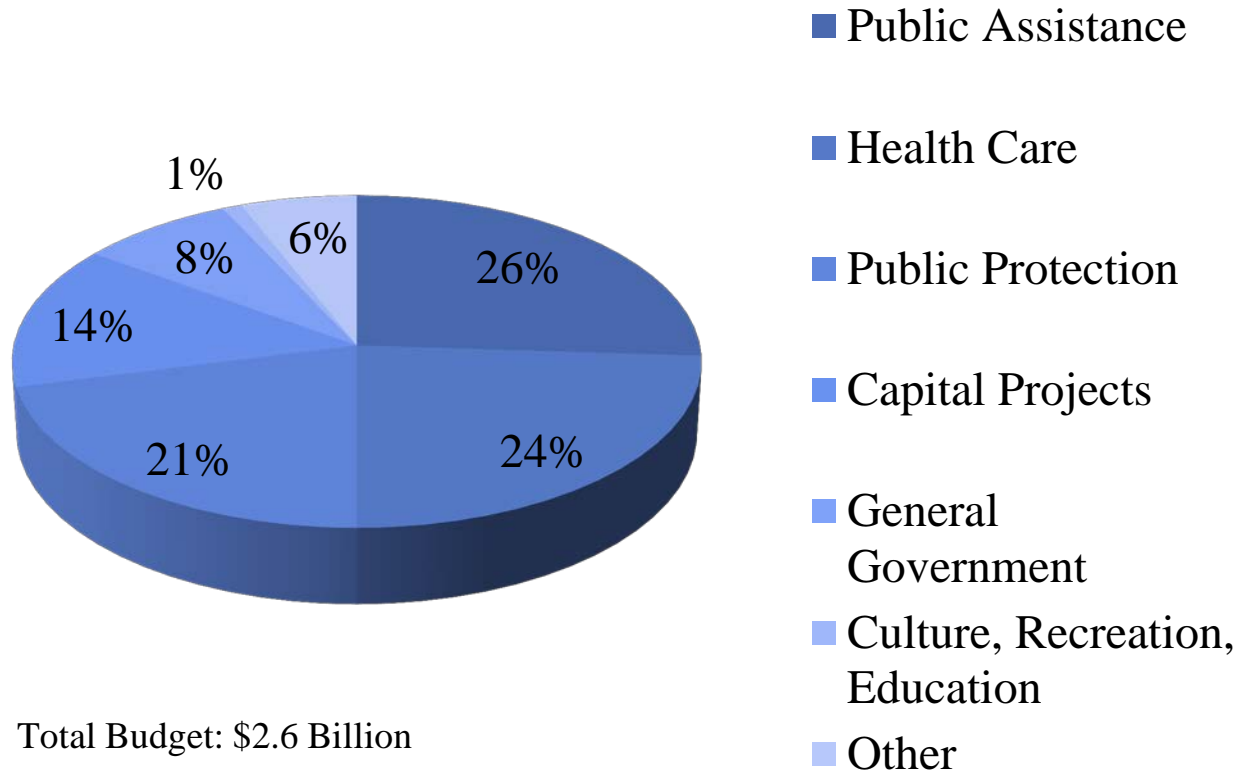
2012-13 Alameda County Funding Sources

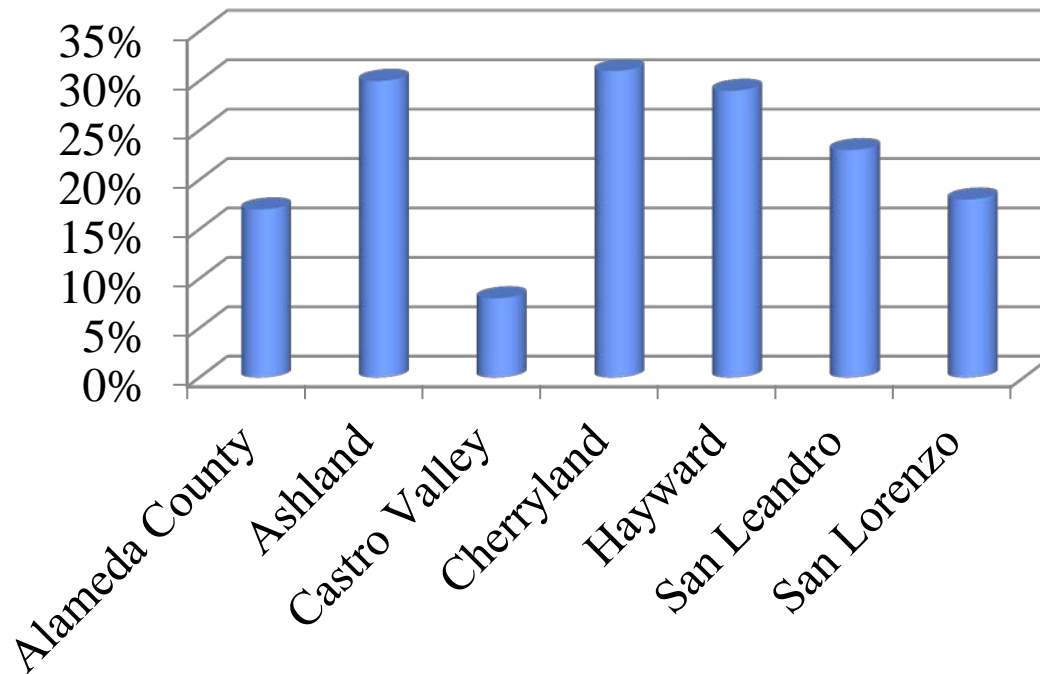

Difference in State Budget 2007-08 to 2013-14

- Overall State Budget ↓ \$5.4 billion
 - Healthy Families/Medi-Cal ↓ \$3.7 billion
 - SSI/SSP ↓ \$4.6 billion
 - Mental Health Services ↓ \$1 billion
 - HHS General Fund ↓ \$700 million
 - Developmental Disabilities ↓ \$997 million
 - Senior Services ↓ \$191 million
 - Senior Nutrition Services ↓ \$533,000
 - K-12 Per Student ↓ \$834

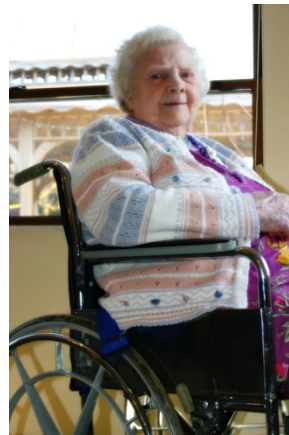

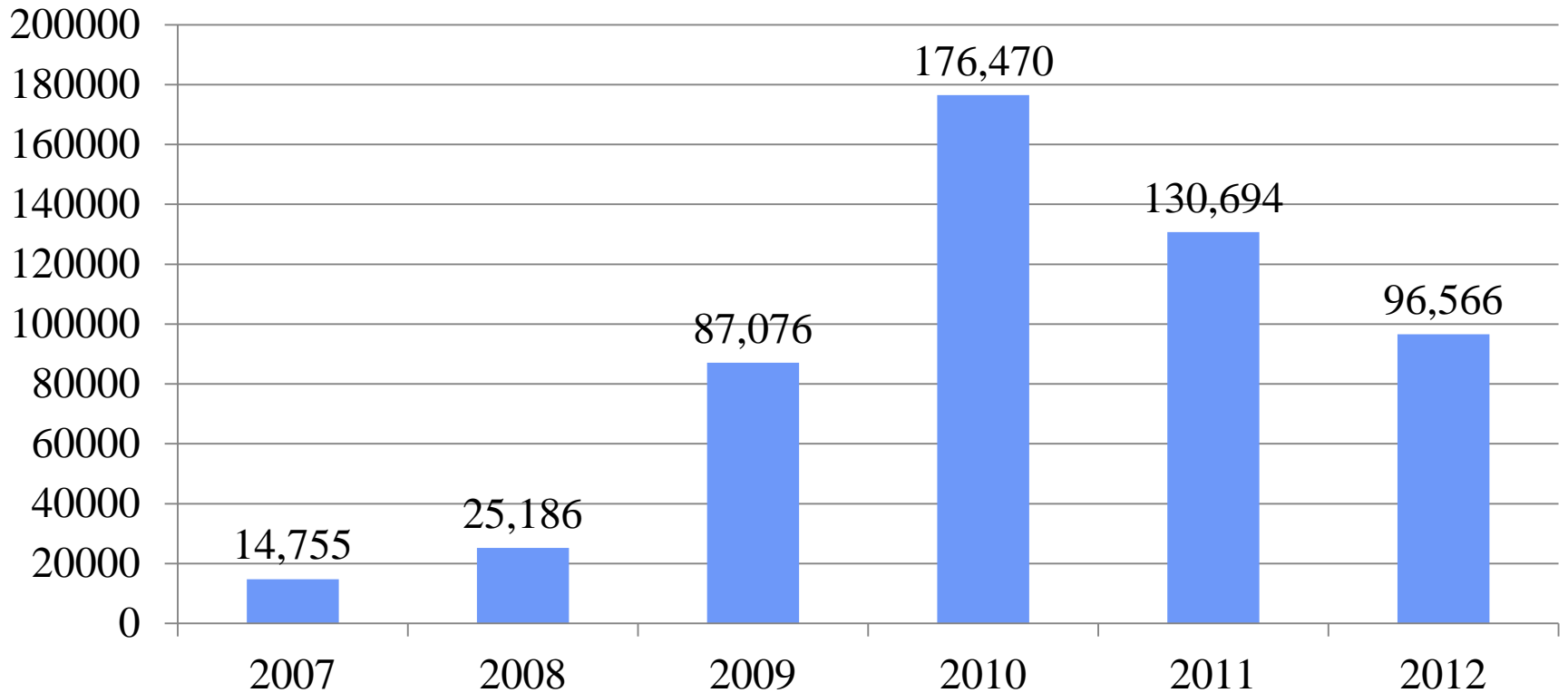

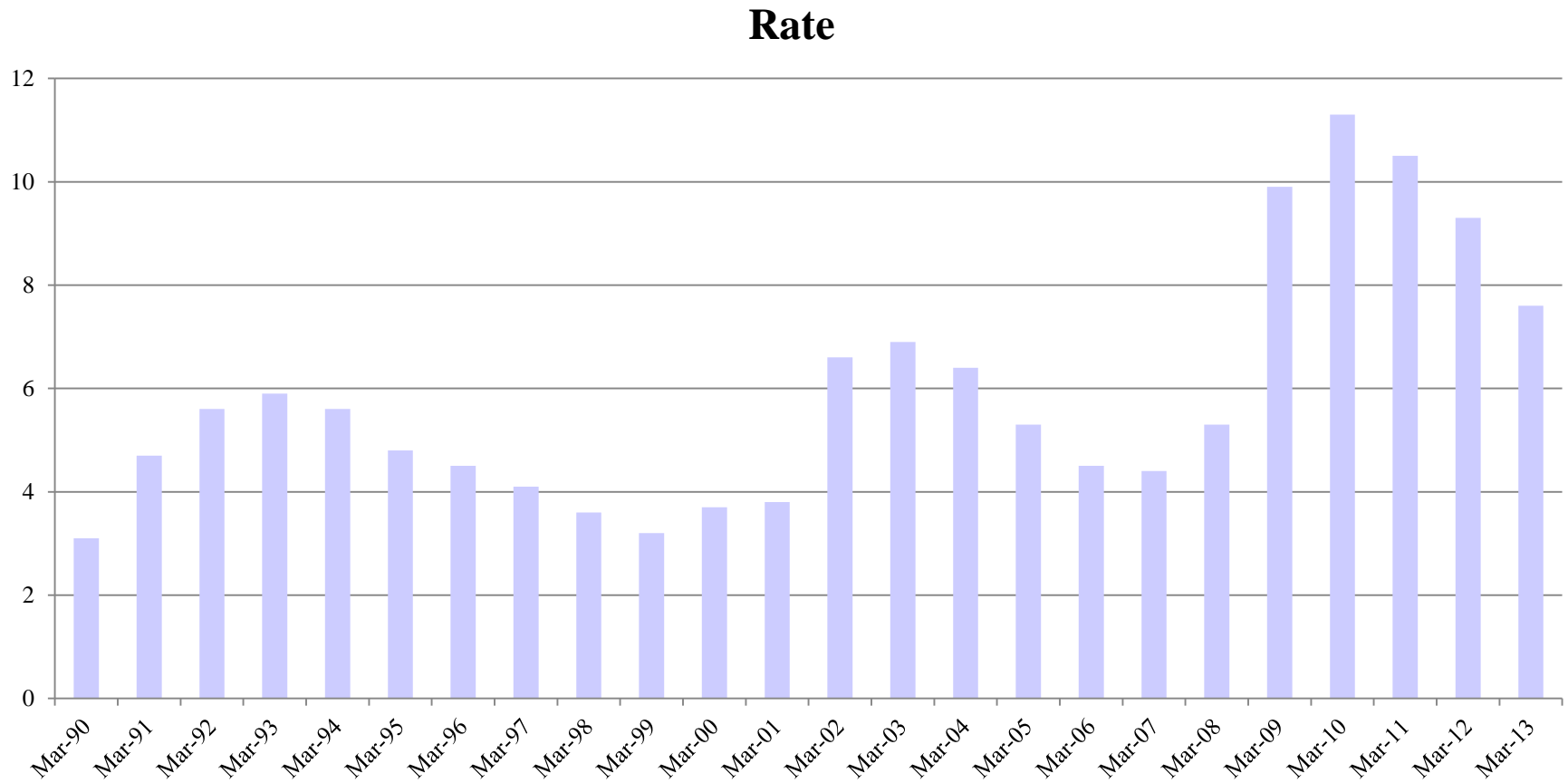
Alameda County Exhausted Unemployment Claims

Exhausted Claims



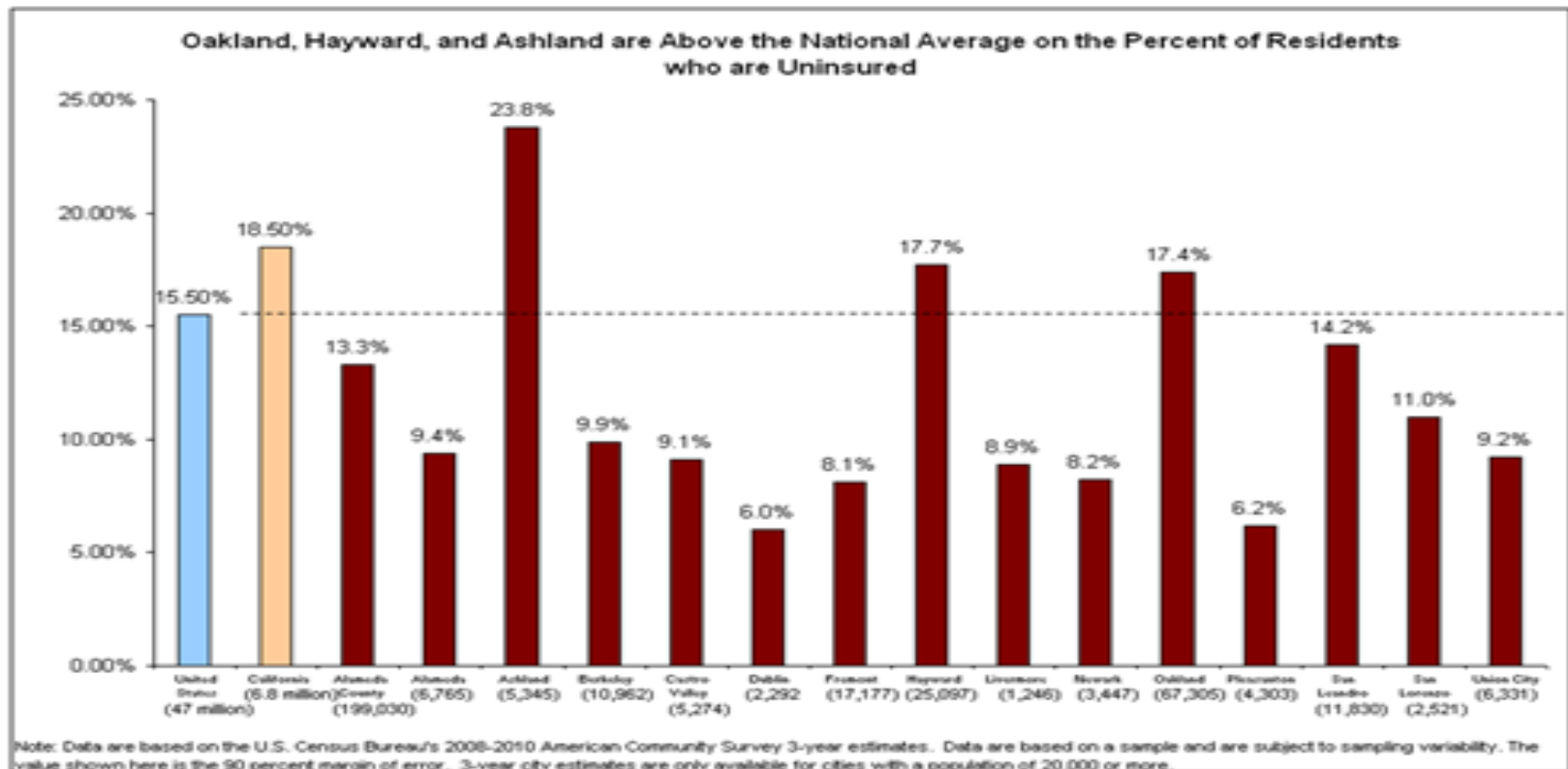


San Leandro Unemployment Rates



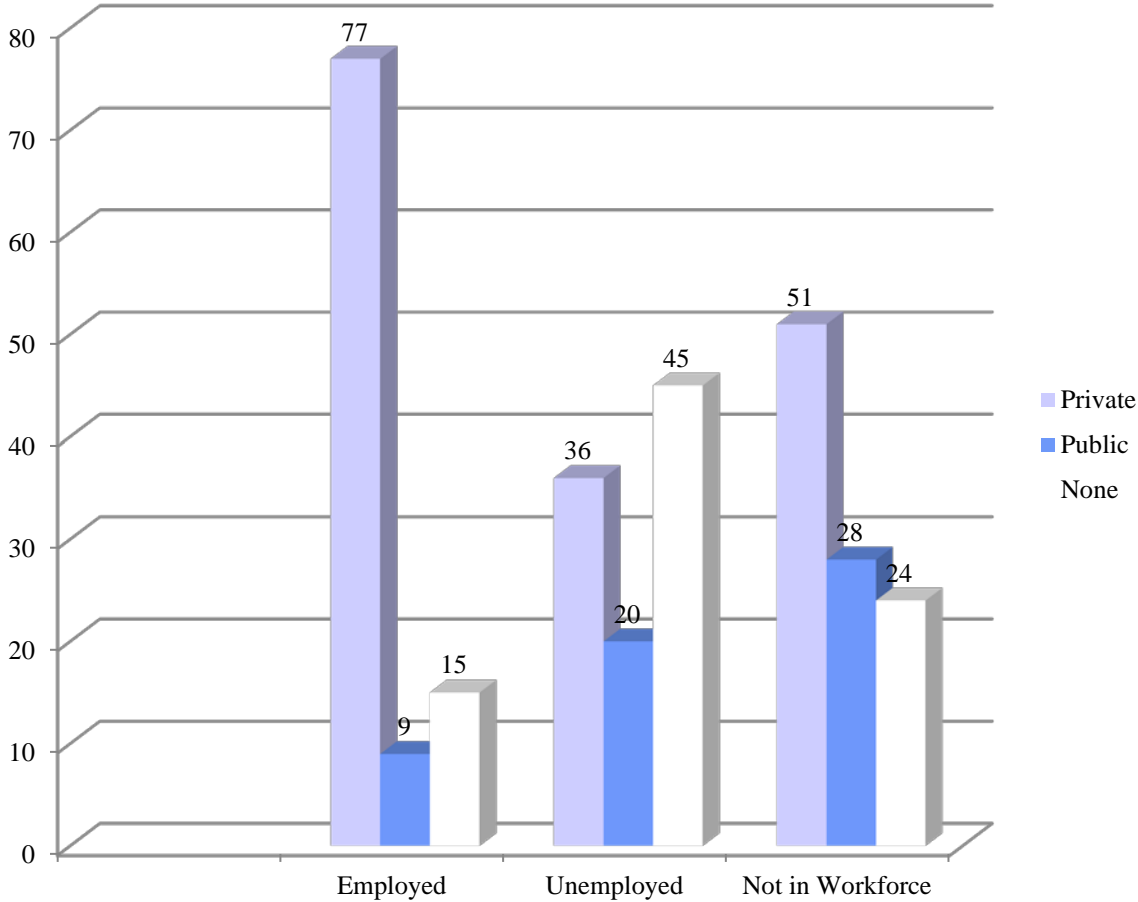


Health Care Insurance





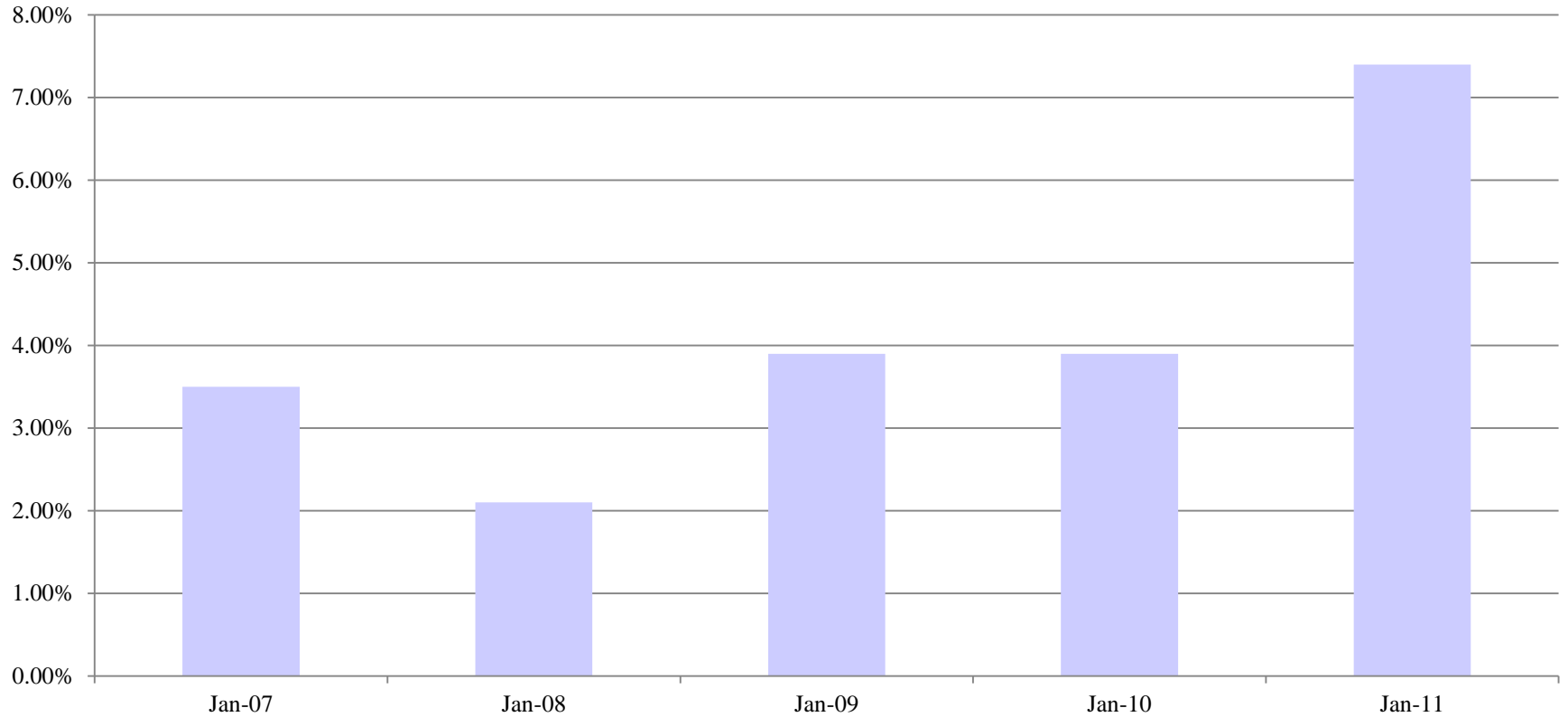
San Leandro Health Insurance

Poverty in California

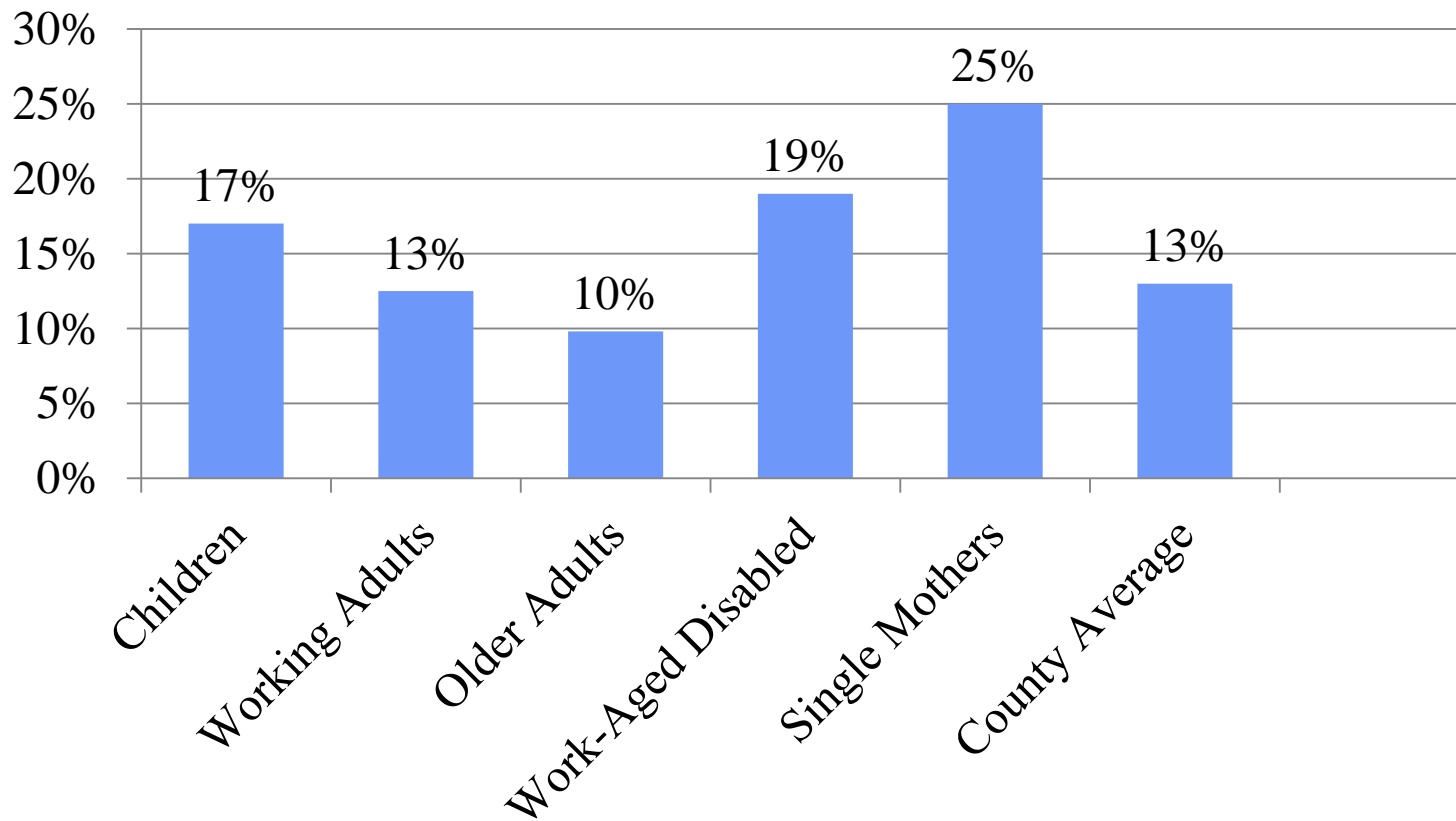
6.4 million people living in poverty is the highest amount in history



That total is **4 times** the number of people living in Alameda County

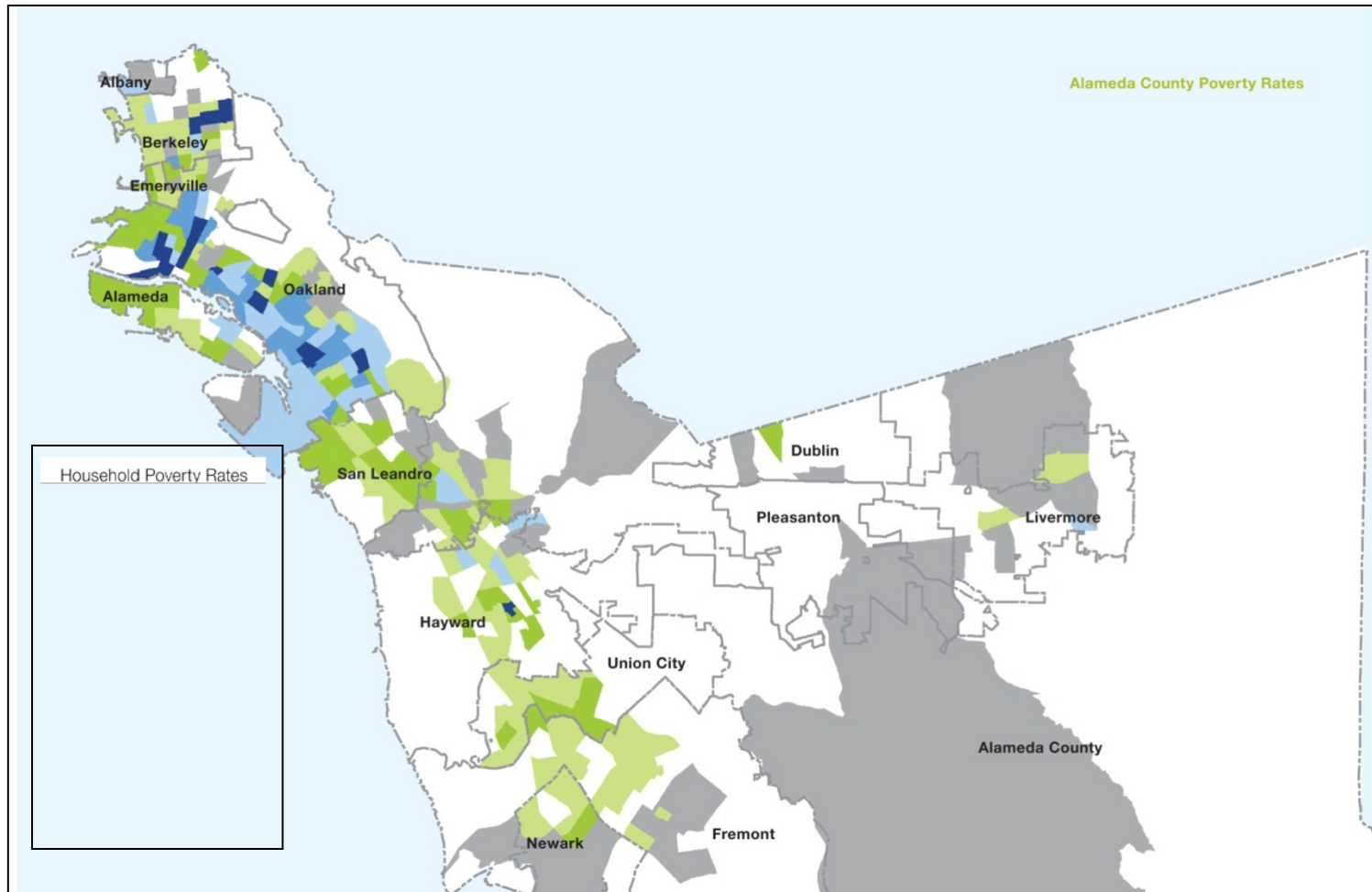


Alameda County Poverty by Group





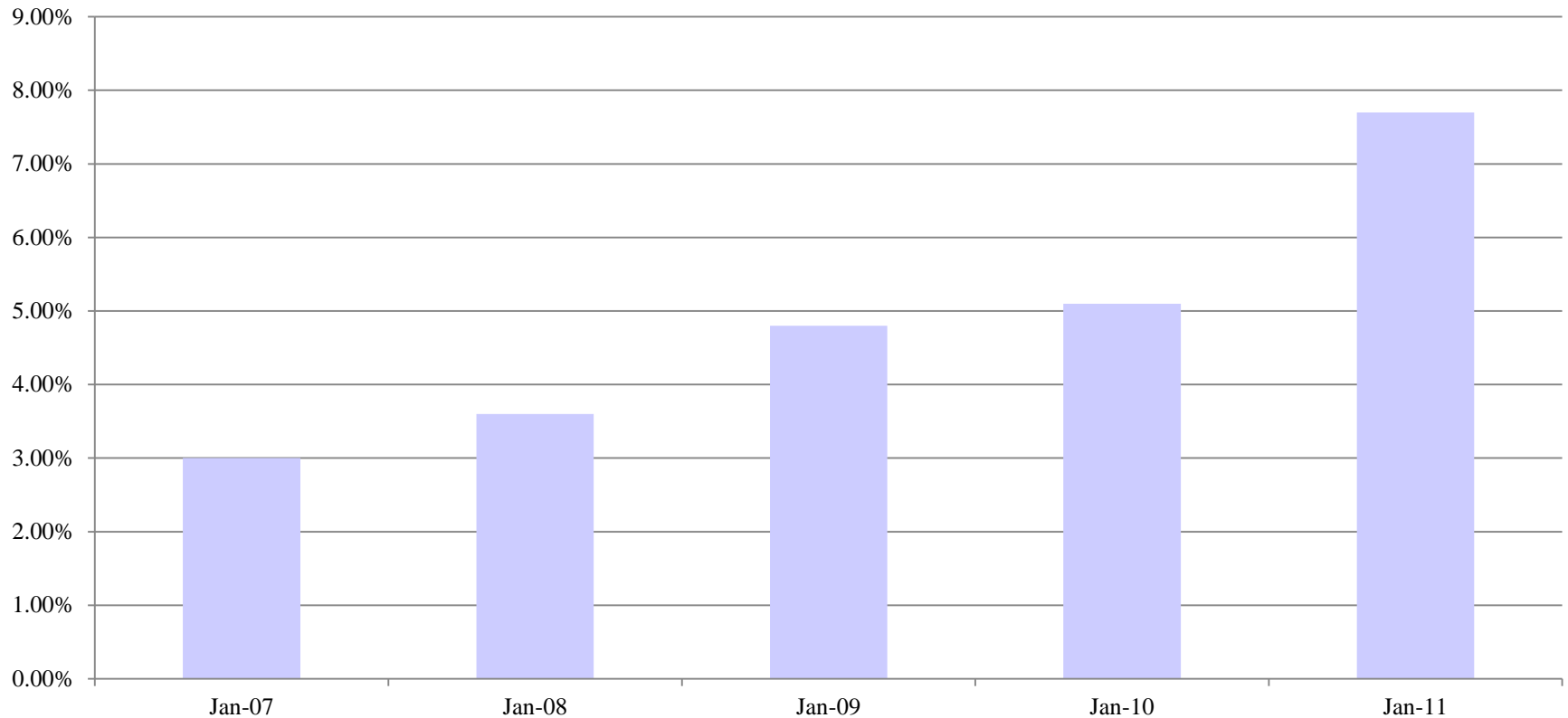
Poverty in Alameda County by Location





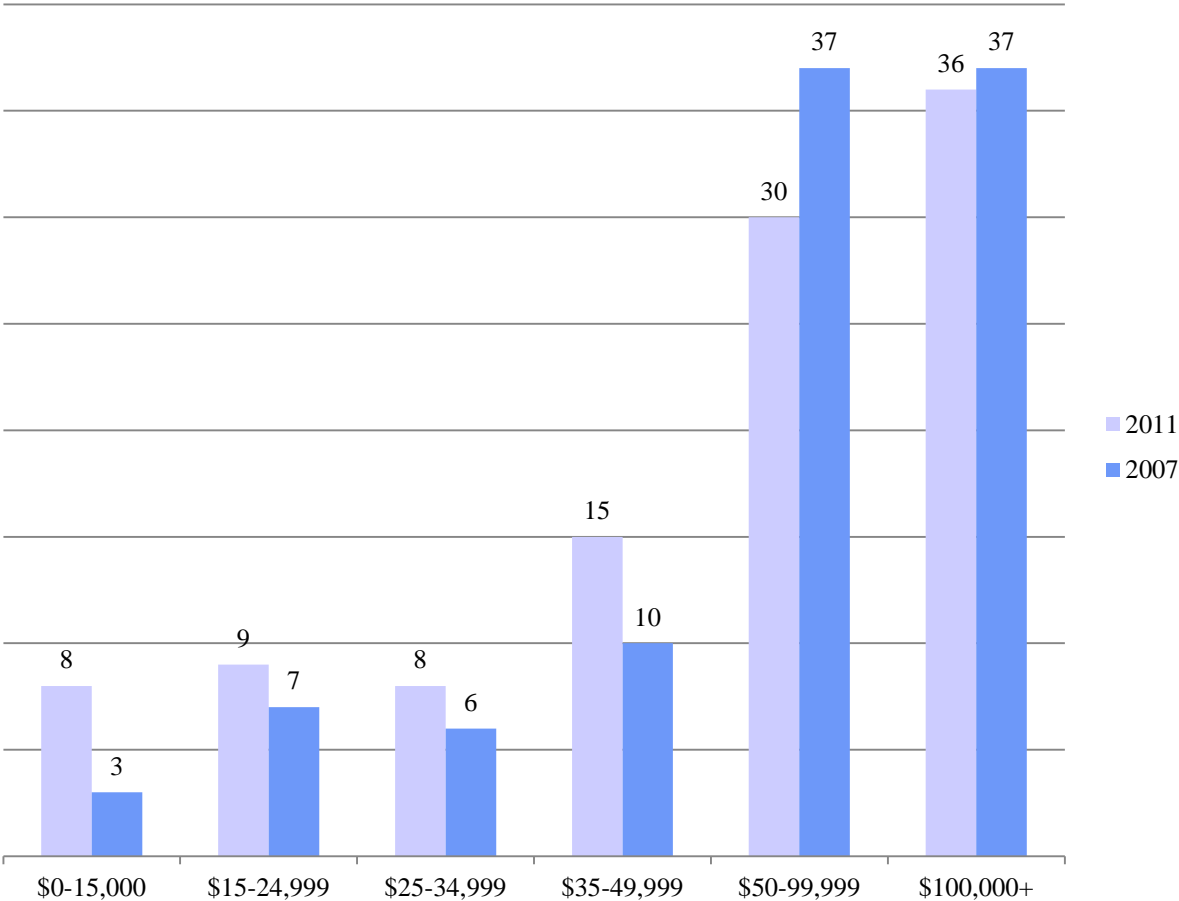
San Leandro Families Earning Less Than \$15,000

Highlight on Female-Led Families

- ❑ Single mothers, regardless of race, experience higher levels of poverty than other adults
- ❑ In 2010, the percentage of single mothers working dropped to its lowest level since 1996
- ❑ State funding for childcare at 15-year low, when adjusted for inflation
- ❑ Twice as many women as men have left community college



Programs Designed To Help Female-Led Families Have Been Cut Hard

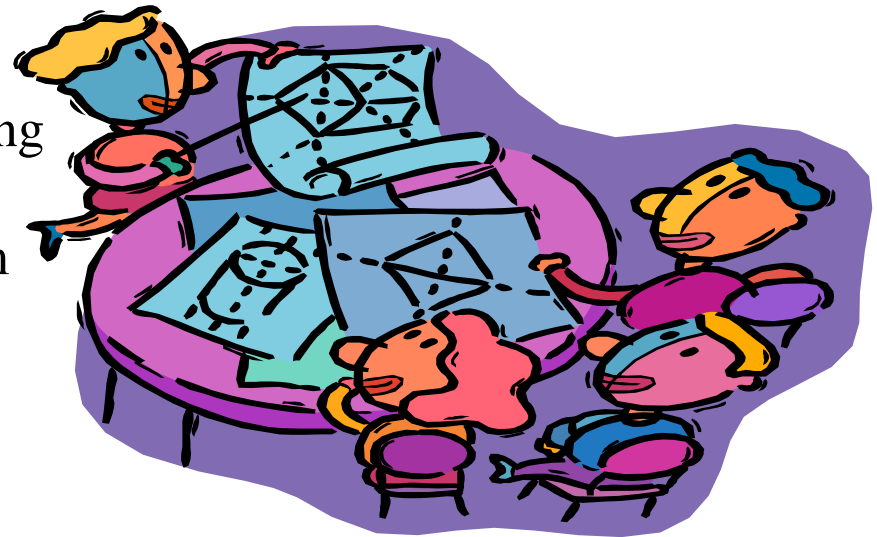
Focus on CalWORKs

- CalWORKs grants cut by 12% since 2007-08
- Maximum annual grant in Alameda County for a family of three is \$7,656
- The actual maximum grant for a family of 3 was higher in 1989 (\$694) than today (\$638)
- The maximum eligibility rate is *below* the Federal Poverty Level
