The Arbor at Hesperian provides safe, affordable homes for San Lorenzo's seniors in a dynamically designed, service-enriched community. The 77 apartments are a homecoming for many—celebrating the local ties of its residents by offering onsite services to connect them with the community while helping San Lorenzo's seniors age in place.

Deeply rooted in collaboration and neighborhood participation, the development and design of The Arbor at Hesperian reflect its local heritage. The site of the former post office is transformed into a beautiful home that respects the fabric of the community with thoughtful outdoor spaces, an orchard, and new walkways connecting residents and the surrounding neighborhood to several nearby amenities and to each other while bringing new life to San Lorenzo.
