HISTORIC, PICTURESQUE NILES CANYON ROAD TO BE CLOSED TO AUTOMOBILES SUNDAY TO MAKE WAY FOR HIKERS, BICYCLISTS

ALAMEDA COUNTY SUPERVISORS SCOTT HAGGERTY AND RICHARD VALLE AVAILABLE FOR INTERVIEWS ABOUT PROPOSED RECREATION TRAIL DURING SUNDAY'S NILES CANYON STROLL & ROLL

Alameda County leaders are offering a unique opportunity on **Sunday, October 11**, when Niles Canyon Road in southern Alameda County will be closed to automobiles to allow hikers and bikers to travel the scenic roadway and examine a proposal to build a new public trail through the Canyon.

To make way for **"The Niles Canyon Stroll and Roll,"** automobiles will be barred from a 6.4-mile stretch of Niles Canyon Road between Old Canyon Road in Fremont and Main Street in Sunol **from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Sunday, October 11**. The closure will include a **Community Meeting between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m.** in which technical experts will be available at both ends of the roadway to answer questions and take public input on the trail proposal.

Alameda County Supervisors Scott Haggerty and Richard Valle, lead organizers of the event, will be available to speak to the media about the proposed trail project from 10:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Sunday at the Sunol Train Depot, Main Street at Kilkare Road in Sunol.
