East Bay EDA will be joined by 16 of its members and partners at Children's Fairyland to introduce STEM to pre-kindergarten children. All organizations will engage in interactive experiments and activities designed to introduce STEM to very young children. Information on teaching tips and home-based activities for parents and caregivers to promote early STEM education will also be provided.
