## TWO ALAMEDA COUNTY BUILDINGS LIT UP IN BLUE AND GOLD TO SUPPORT GOLDEN STATE WARRIORS' DRIVE FOR NBA FINALS

Alameda County is lighting up two of its Oakland buildings – the Rene C. Davidson Courthouse and its newly acquired office complex next to Interstate 880 – in blue and gold to show support for the Golden State Warriors as the team makes its push for the National Basketball Association Finals.

In addition to the bold LED exterior lighting at the courthouse at 1225 Fallon Street and the office complex (the former Zhone Technologies headquarters at 7195 Oakport Street), both buildings today will be adorned with banners saying, "Alameda County is Warriors Ground."

The banners will be in place in time for tonight's Game 5 of the NBA Western Conference Finals against the Houston Rockets at the Oracle Arena in Oakland. The game is scheduled to start at 6 p.m.

"Alameda County is extremely proud of our hometown team and the excellent season they have had," said Scott Haggerty, President of the Alameda County Board of Supervisors. "We want to do our part to rally the community behind the Warriors as they seek to make it to the NBA Finals for the first time in 40 years."

Added Susan S. Muranishi, Alameda County Administrator: "When people see the Warriors' blue and gold lighting up the Oakland skyline they will know that all of Alameda County is standing behind our team."
