Oakland, CA – In the national conversation about criminal justice, immigration, and education, the needs of Asian and Pacific Islander American boys and men are often left out. In cities such as Oakland, AAPI youth have had very high arrest rates: Samoans with 140 per 1000—the highest rate in the city--Cambodians with 63 per 1000, and Laotians with 52 per 1000. For the first time in Alameda County, Supervisor Keith Carson, with the Asian Community Collaborative (ACC) and other elected officials, will convene a forum to discuss the needs unique to API boys and men on Thursday, April 14, from 5:30 to 8:00pm at the Elihu Harris State Building. Leaders in local community activism and philanthropy will come together to craft a strategy on how to address these challenges.

The event will have remarks by the elected officials, including Supervisor Keith Carson, Supervisor Wilma Chan, and Assemblymember Rob Bonta.
