East Bay High School Students Learn from the Experts At STEM Career Awareness Day 2016

- Wednesday, April 27, 2016 from 9:00 am – 3pm.
- Aquatic Park Center: Tent at 717 Potter Street, Berkeley, CA 94710

A growing public/private collaboration aimed at building a local STEM talent pipeline will show students the innovation careers that are within their grasp in the Bay Area's thriving STEM innovation companies.

- 300 local high school students will tour 25 STEM companies, lunch with STEM professionals, and participate in hands-on demonstrations to learn about career opportunities requiring education ranging from a one-year community college degree to a Ph.D.
- Students will hear from speakers including Alameda County Supervisor Keith Carson, and Adrienne Ursino, from Congresswoman Barbara Lee's Office.
- East Bay STEM Career Awareness Day 2016, organized by Cal State University East Bay's Institute for STEM Education, is the latest in a focused—and growing—collaboration between educational institutions, the business community, and local government to address the twin regional needs of good jobs for a diverse population, and a trained workforce for the innovation companies that drive our economy. STEM Career Awareness Day is one component of a comprehensive approach that includes increasing the number of businesses engaged in direct work with students and educators, training a diverse teacher corps, and bringing hands-on science learning labs into low-income communities.
