ICONIC ALAMEDA COUNTY COURTHOUSE TO BE LIT UP IN BLUE AND GOLD TO SUPPORT GOLDEN STATE WARRIORS' DRIVE FOR NBA FINALS

Starting this week, Alameda County will be lighting up its iconic the Rene C. Davidson Courthouse in Oakland in blue and gold to support the Golden State Warriors as the team makes its push for the National Basketball Association Finals.

In addition to the bold LED exterior lighting at the courthouse at 1225 Fallon Street, large blue and gold banners bearing the slogan, "Strength in Numbers" will adorn the courthouse and several other buildings in and around the Alameda County complex in downtown Oakland.

The banners and lighting should be in place in time for the Warriors' next scheduled home game, Thursday night in its NBA Western Conference Finals clash against the Oklahoma City Thunder.

"Last year we lit up the courthouse and found it to be a stunning show of support for the Warriors as they went on to win their first NBA title in 40 years," said Scott Haggerty, President of the Alameda County Board of Supervisors. "So as our Warriors try to reach a second straight NBA Finals, we know the time is right to pull out all the stops to support them."

Added Susan S. Muranishi, Alameda County Administrator: "When people see the Warriors' blue and gold lighting up the courthouse each night, they will know that all of Alameda County is standing behind our team."
