The Programmatic Advisory Subcommittee will work closely with community-based organizations, systems-impacted youth (current and former) and their families, and relevant justice stakeholder groups (i.e. AC Youth Council), to gather critical information, expertise, and diverse perspectives, and make recommendations to support the Programming goals outlined in this document; thereby further expanding ACPD's reach into the Community.
