✓ To obtain the Community Advisory Board's opinion on whether the Alameda County Board of Supervisors should establish a Sheriff's Oversight Board and/or an Office of the Inspector General pursuant to Assembly Bill 1185.



Overview Of Assembly Bill 1185

- ✓ Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 30, 2020
- ✓ Effective January 1, 2021
- **✓** Adds section 25303.7 to the Government Code
- ✓ Authorizes each of the 58 California counties, either by board of supervisor action or vote of county residents, to create civilian oversight bodies over their elected sheriffs and to vest them with the power of subpoena.
- ✓ Supports accountability through independent oversight
- ✓ Can include a Sheriff's Oversight Board and/or an Office of the Inspector General
