Does that include interventions that have been or will be evaluated? Those interventions are available through our CBOs. They are either promising or best practices.</p> <p>Does Probation receive the \$21M as per the slide? This amount is not what we get. Funds are added from the trust to our allocations.</p> <p>How many young people are getting served and how are we monitoring our clients' progress? There are approximately 200 youth that are on probation. The CBOs receive referrals and they are required to enter case notes regarding the youth's progress. The rest of the funds are for kids in the community. The programs must use a program called Mobius to track</p>

This provides higher level data for the kids that are not under probation supervision.</p> <p data-bbox="414 304 1193 367">How many youth are being served under the JJCPA umbrella and are there any measures of effectiveness?</p> <p data-bbox="414 373 1209 472">There have not been any formal evaluations of the programs.
