The outreach efforts included making announcements at the JJCC and SB 823 Subcommittee meetings, email blasts, and posting on the ACPD website. The application deadline had been extended twice. How many applications for Districts 2, 3, and 4? Only one for each of those districts. Is it required that current members be removed after their term expires or can the current members stay on until new members are approved? Per County Counsel guidance, those seats become vacant. The bylaws are silent on that matter. • It was requested that Probation extend the deadline for all positions • The Probation outreach efforts were similar to efforts two years ago. A good faith effort was made to notify existing member and recruit new members • The bylaws were put in place last year; some positions will be vacant by end of month • Considering the vacancies, the JJCC will still be able to carry out the duties and meet quorum if enough members attend the next meeting. The SB 823 has 17 members, and nine are needed to establish quorum.
