## ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE FOR THE NOVEMBER 3, 2020 ELECTION?

The November 3<sup>rd</sup> Election in Alameda County will be different!

The Alameda County Registrar of Voters will mail a ballot to every registered voter in the County. *There will be no neighborhood polling places.* Instead, there will be 100 in-person Vote Centers and 66 ballot drop boxes in all of Alameda County.

Are you registered to vote at your current address? Do you have a mailing address on your voter registration record? *Make sure your residence and mailing addresses are up to date on your voter registration or you will not get your Voter Guides or ballot.* If you are unhoused, you can register to vote by describing where you usually stay at night. Use the nearest cross streets and be sure to provide a mailing address.

Check your registration, update it, or register to vote **NOW** at <u>www.registertovote.ca.gov</u>. Call 800-345-VOTE (8683) to get a paper registration form.

The following timeline for the election shows why it is important for voters to register to vote NOW.

## Timeline for voters for the November 3, 2020 election

**September 24:** The Registrar of Voters begins mailing County Voter Guides to **each voter** and the Secretary of State begins mailing the State Voter Guide to **each household** of voters **registered as of September 4.** 

**October 5:** The Registrar of Voters begins mailing ballots to all registered voters. Last day to mail ballots is 7 days before the election.

**October 19**: Deadline to register to vote.

**Oct. 20-Nov 3:** Voters who missed the October 19 deadline may register conditionally and vote provisionally **in person** at the Registrar of Voters Office, 1225 Fallon St. Room G-1 Oakland, CA 94612 or at any vote center in Alameda County from Saturday, October 31 to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
