You will enroll in a paid orientation led by seasoned instructors to ensure you are ready for work and our program. Upon completion, you will begin your new job on CEO's transitional work crews. This part-time job is paid daily–not many employers offer that perk!

Find a full-time job

While working for CEO, you'll have access to a variety of free training opportunities and be assigned a job coach who will help prepare you for full-time work. CEO will also conduct outreach to local businesses on your behalf with the goal of finding you a full-time job. If hired, CEO will provide continued support for up to a year of your full-time employment.
