

Six decades after the US Supreme Court ruled in Brown vs. the Board of Education against racially segregated education, people of color and low-incomes still receive unequal educations, with devastating results.

Over 80 percent of the incarcerated population are high school dropouts,

High school dropouts cost taxpayers \$292,000 over the course of their lives.

Five Keys provides students with an opportunity to earn a high school diploma, GED or obtain workforce training, while providing necessary supports to help them achieve their goals.




