**REPORT- OUT on Programming/Staffing/Demographics –
*James River and Jessica Fort***

Updates

- COVID-19 and mental health screening procedures continue to take place for all youth.
- The APDS tablets were rolled out at Juvenile Hall.
- All of the Title-15 minimum requirements are being met through virtual avenues.

Staffing

- The JIO recruitment recently closed with 300 potential applicants. Background investigations for previous applicants are being conducted.

Demographics

- Number of youths at JJC - 52 (45 males, 7 females)
- Number of youth 14year old and under -1
- Number of youth on GPS – 60
- Number of youth on Home Supervision - 34
- Number of youths at Camp - 9
- Number of youth on Camp count -15
- Number of youth on Aftercare - 13

Programming

- Camp is moving forward with tablet school and starting a credit recovery program.
- The Oakland Police Department visited the Camp and spoke with youth about life choices.
- On May 4, 2020, a graduation for 3 MC3 youth was held and families participated via Microsoft Teams.
- Camp has a new cooking club program, led by two Juvenile Institution Officers who instruct the youth on what needs to be done and how to do it. Youth can earn elective credits for participation.
- The Aftercare program had its first youth completion within 3 months, the youth is now discharged from Probation.
- Camp Sweeney has expanded to incorporate the name Wilmont Sweeney Academy. All camp programming and activities will be grouped under this new name.
- Camp youth have been provided new uniforms.
