#### 4. Commission Update(s), Announcements and Comments:

- a. The Commission welcomed former Youth Commissioner Xochtil Larios as a new Commissioner; she was sworn in on November 8, 2023.

#### **II. Presentation:**

#### Overview of Opioid Use Disorder and Treatment for Our Youth, William Burrough, MD, MPH

- 1. Youth drug use is a significant public health concern that is linked to many serious health problems, academic and social challenges. In Alameda County overdoses make up the largest number of drug deaths and have steadily and dramatically increasing since 2017. The numbers were elevated prior to the pandemic, and since the pandemic the numbers have skyrocketed.
- 2. There is a racial disparity in treatment amongst Native American, Black, and Latino youth. There are barriers to care, a racial disparity in treatment access to medication for addiction treatment.
- 3. For people with Opioid Use Disorder, Suboxone reduces the risk of death from any cause by 50%.
  - o People in correctional settings have 100x greater risk of overdose death than the general population.
- 4. Addiction is...
  - o a chronic medical disease and return to use (relapse) is a normal part of the course.
  - Addiction is not a moral failing (and neither is return to use)
  - Society and systems (including healthcare) perpetuate the stigma against people with substance use disorders.
- 5. Opioid 101
  - o Opioid have been called following, Percs, Vicodin, Norco, Oxy, Heroin, Fentanyl, Fent, and Fenny
  - o Almost all street pills have some fentanyl in them.
  - o Routes of usage include oral, intranasal, inhaled, and injected.
  - O You cannot overdose from simply touching someone who has used fentanyl.
- 6. Medications for Opioid Use Disorder
  - o Buprenorphine or Suboxone can stop withdrawal and cravings immediately. It can protect against overdose. It is lifesaving with more than 50% reduction in all-cause mortality.
  - o The chance of relapse to taking opioids is 8x higher without buprenorphine.
  - There is significant improved retention in treatment, reduced transmission of HIV or Hep C, and improved daily functioning.
