

# Open Gate Student Update Fall 2019 & Spring 2020

#### Introduction

Open Gate, Inc. is a registered 501(c)(3) non-profit community based organization dedicated to guiding and facilitating system-impacted members of our community to purposeful college education and targeted technical training.

In July 2016, Chabot College, Hayward, CA partnered with Open Gate, Inc. and Santa Rita Jail to establish the RISE Program. This Jail-to-College pipeline successfully transitions inmates from Open Gate College Readiness classes inside Santa Rita Jail to the RISE Program at Chabot College, and provides students with wrap-around support services on campus.

# **Purpose of this Report**

This report provides a status update on the RISE students to enable effective collaboration and alignment on program objectives, deliverables and outcomes.

# Fall 2019

#### **Matriculation Data**

Intake and matriculation into RISE Program includes:

#### 73 Students

Male 63 (86% of students)

an increase of 27 students (46%) from Spring 2019 semester

Female 10 (14% of students)

a decrease of 5 students (33%) from Spring 2019 semester

Military Veterans\* 3 (4% of students)

a decrease of 1 student (25%) from Spring 2019 semester

\*Registered with Chabot Veteran's Center. All Honorably Discharged



#### Observations:

- Significant increase in enrollment of almost 50%, despite a drop in female enrollment.
- In January 2020, Open Gate established college readiness workshops specifically for female inmates in Santa Rita. The impact of these efforts are anticipated to appear in Fall 2020 enrollment numbers.

#### Race Demographic

African American 38 (52% of students)

an increase of 6 students (19%) from Spring 2019 semester

Latino 24 (33% of students)

an increase of 11 students (85%) from Spring 2019 semester

White 9 (12% of students)

an increase of 5 students (125%) from Spring 2019 semester

Pacific Islander 2 (3% of students)

an increase of 1 student (100%) from Spring 2019 semester

**Observations:** Increased enrollment in all race demographic categories. The greatest numerical increases were in:

# Age Demographic\*\*

18 - 29 yrs.27 (37% of students)30 - 39 yrs.29 (40% of students)40 - 49 yrs.10 (14% of students)50 - 60 yrs.6 (8% of students)60+ yrs.1 (1% of students)

**Observations**: A marked increase in enrollment by younger students with the primary shift to students under 40 years old.



#### Where our students came from:

Santa Rita Jail: 62 %

Parole and Community Team Meetings (PACT Meetings - Prison System): 22%

Chabot Community College In-reach: 8%

Community Outreach: 8%

#### **Achievements**

Open Gate, Inc. reports less than 2% recidivism (1 student from 74 enrolled) for Fall 2019. This student is now re-enrolled for Spring 2020 and attending college.

# Spring 2020

#### **Matriculation Data**

Intake and matriculation into RISE Program includes:

#### 62 Students

Male 55 (89% of students)

a year on year increase of 20 students (60%) from Spring 2019 enrollment

Female 7 (11% of students)

a year on year decrease of 8 students (53%) from Spring 2019 enrollment

#### **Observations**

- An overall increase in enrollment of 24%, despite a noted drop in female enrollment.
- Note: In January 2020, Open Gate, Inc. established college readiness workshops specifically for female inmates in Santa Rita Jail. The impact of these efforts are anticipated to appear in Fall 2020 enrollment numbers.

#### Race Demographic

African American 23 (37% of students)

a year on year decrease of 9 students (28%) from Spring 2019 enrollment

Latino 20 (32% of students)

a year on year increase of 7 students (54%) from Spring 2019 enrollment

From Incarceration to GRADUATION!



White 15 (24% of students)

a year on year increase of 11 students (275%) from Spring 2019 enrollment

Pacific Islander 3 (5% of students)

a year on year increase of 2 students (200%) from Spring 2019 enrollment

Asia 1 (2% of students)

a year on year increase of 1 student from Spring 2019 enrollment

**Observations**: Shifting enrollment in all race demographic categories with noted increases in Latino and White students.

# Age Demographic\*\*

18-29 yrs	19 (31% of students)
30-39 yrs	26 (42% of students)
40-49 yrs	7 (11% of students)
50-60 yrs	6 (10% of students)
60+ yrs	4 (6% of students)

**Observations**: A continued strong enrollment by younger students with over 70% of students under 40 years of age, a demographic that includes a high number of young fathers.
