FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

City of Oakland seeks proposals from organizations to provide career development, job training services

Oakland, CA – Through March 6, 2019, the City of Oakland's Workforce Development Board (OWDB) is accepting proposals from organizations to provide workforce development services for adults and youth using approximately \$2 million in federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funds under its purview. The goal of these investments is to help individuals to build skills and acquire credentials for employment and assist businesses with finding and retaining a qualified workforce. Contracts resulting from this RFP process are anticipated to run from July 2019 through June 2022.

The OWDB is issuing two separate RFP's: one for services for low and very-low income youth and young adults, ages 16-24, and a second to operate career centers and provide direct services for adult job seekers and workers, 18 and older. Through each of these RFP processes, the OWDB seeks to resource a network of qualified providers to make WIOA services more accessible to priority populations and geographical areas (East Oakland, Central/Fruitvale and West Oakland) and advance the economic security and resilience of Oakland's most vulnerable residents so they can secure quality jobs and careers in high growth pathways and industries.

Publication of Probation Data: In the spirit of transparency and in support of its [Strategic Plan: Vision 2023](#) and the County's [Strategic Vision 2026](#), the Alameda County Probation Department is proud to announce the posting of Probation data on the County's [Open Data site](#). This data represents point-in-time population information on those under the jurisdiction of the Alameda County Probation Department through the courts. It includes adults and youth supervised by Probation in the community, as well as youth in detention in Juvenile Hall and juvenile commitments to Camp Wilmont Sweeney.

The first set of data consists of Quarters 1, 2, and 3 for calendar year 2018. New datasets will be posted every quarter thereafter and updated with accompanying information. In order to maintain the confidentiality of those under Probation's jurisdiction, the datasets will not contain identifying information, but will contain demographics consisting of race, age, gender, city of residence, supervision designation and current location, i.e., community supervision, Juvenile Hall, or Camp Wilmont Sweeney. However, while the datasets are de-identified, they will contain individual-level data and allow for users to analyze and manipulate the data.

Additionally, the Probation Department has posted information on its own [website](#) including interactive dashboards illustrating the quarterly data, instructions for using the dashboards, and a population profile summarizing the data.

FREE Transition to College course being taught in an **Alameda Adult School** ESL class. See attached flyer *ESL students must be in Level 6 – ESL Advanced Class

Why the need for this course?

Incoming ESOL/ESL students may not be familiar with the American higher education system and its conventions. As a result, they struggle with pre-enrollment procedures including registration and assessment. The course contextualizes these processes and provides students with both information and practical skills to ease their transition from adult school and CBO to community college.

Course Description

Outreach and orientation for individuals making the transition from adult school and other CBOs to community college: familiarity with resources available on campus; hands-on assistance with application and enrollment; culminates in students completing the new student application process/enrolling in their first community college course.

East Bay Community Recovery Project is hosting post-incarceration groups called “Staying Free”.
