GO-Biz Now Accepting Applications for the California Community Reinvestment Grants Program

Sacramento, CA – The Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) announced that it is now accepting applications for the California Community Reinvestment Grants (CalCRG) program. GO-Biz will award grants to local health departments and community-based nonprofit organizations to provide qualifying support services to communities harmed by the War on Drugs.

"The War on Drugs ravaged communities across the state," said the Governor's Chief Economic and Business Advisor and Director of GO-Biz Lenny Mendonca. "The California Community Reinvestments Grants program is an important step towards reinvesting in these communities to repair the multi-generational impacts of the War on Drugs."

About the CalCRG program

The CalCRG program was included in The Adult Use of Marijuana Act (Proposition 64), which was approved by California voters on November 8, 2016. In accordance with the proposition, GO-Biz will award grants to local health departments and community-based nonprofit organizations to support the following activities for communities disproportionately affected by past federal and state drug policies, also known as the War on Drugs:

- Job placement
- Mental health treatment
- Substance use disorder treatment

- System navigation services
- Legal services to address barriers to reentry
- Linkages to medical care

Funding for the program is expected to grow from \$10 million this fiscal year to \$50 million for fiscal year 22/23 and each year thereafter.

Publication of Probation Data: In the spirit of transparency and in support of its <u>Strategic Plan: Vision 2023</u> and the County's <u>Strategic Vision 2026</u>, the Alameda County Probation Department is proud to announce the posting of Probation data on the County's <u>Open Data site</u>. This data represents point-in-time population information on those under the jurisdiction of the Alameda County Probation Department through the courts. It includes adults and youth supervised by Probation in the community, as well as youth in detention in Juvenile Hall and juvenile commitments to Camp Wilmont Sweeney.

The first set of data consists of Quarters 1, 2, and 3 for calendar year 2018. New datasets will be posted every quarter thereafter and updated with accompanying information. In order to maintain the confidentiality of those under Probation's jurisdiction, the datasets will not contain identifying information, but will contain demographics consisting of race, age, gender, city of residence, supervision designation and current location, i.e., community supervision, Juvenile Hall, or Camp Wilmont Sweeney. However, while the datasets are de-identified, they will contain individual-level data and allow for users to analyze and manipulate the data.

Additionally, the Probation Department has posted information on its own <u>website</u> including interactive dashboards illustrating the quarterly data, instructions for using the dashboards, and a population profile summarizing the data.
