Five Keys announces their FREE evening T4C and CBISA classes:

T4C involves cognitive changes and the development of problem-solving skills for those who seek to change their life and lifestyle through the way one thinks. This will help individuals take control of their lives by taking control of their thinking. If you want to establish a new way of life based on a new way of thinking this class is for you. T4C stresses interpersonal communication skills development and confronts thought patterns that can lead to problematic behaviors.

CBISA is an intervention that relies on a cognitive behavioral approach to teach participants strategies to manage risk factors. This class will teach participants strategies for avoiding substance abuse. The program places heavy emphasis on skill building activities to assist with cognitive, social, emotional, and coping skill development.
