

SB1004-TRANSITIONAL AGE YOUTH PROGRAM

APRIL 10, 2019

 Authorizes specified counties to establish a deferred entry of judgment pilot program for eligible defendants

Eligibility:

- 18 20 years of age at the time of the offense
- Felony offense
- Defendant pleads guilty to charge(s)
- Suitable for the program and demonstrates an ability to benefit from services normally reserved for juvenile offenders
- Does not have to register pursuant to Penal Code Section 290
- Has not been convicted of an offense listed under Penal Code Sections 1192.7(c) or 667.5(c) or Welfare and Institution Code Section 707(b)



- Requires the Court to grant deferred entry of judgment if an eligible defendant consents to participation in the program
- Allows for programming/detention within juvenile hall
- Requires the Probation Department to develop a plan for re-entry services
- Successful completion of the program will result in the dismissal of charges
- While in custody, requires separation from minors in juvenile hall
- Data
 - Recidivism
- Unfunded pilot
