SUBJECT: APPROVE A FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION MASTER CONTRACT WITH YOUTH ALIVE! TO CONTINUE TO PROVIDE HOSPITAL-BASED VIOLENCE INTERVENTION COUNSELING FOR YOUTH

Dear Board Members:

RECOMMENDATIONS

A. Approve a First Amendment to the Community-Based Organization Master Contract (Master Contract No. 900522; Procurement Contract No. 25473) with Youth ALIVE! (Principal: Joseph Griffin; Location: Oakland) to provide hospital-based violence intervention counseling for youth, extending the term 7/1/23 – 6/30/24 by 3 months to 9/30/24, and increasing the not-to-exceed amount from \$213,835 to \$267,294 (\$53,459 increase); and

B. Delegate authority to the Alameda County Health Director, or designee, to execute the First Amendment subject to approval as to form by County Counsel and submit executed contract to the Clerk of the Board for filing

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY

Alameda County Health (AC Health), formerly known as Alameda County Health Care Services Agency, requests your Board to approve a Community-Based Organization (CBO) Master Contract Amendment with Youth ALIVE! to continue to provide hospital-based violence intervention counseling to up to 200 youth and young adults from Alameda County through the Caught in the Crossfire Program for an additional three months through 9/30/24.

Youth ALIVE! is a non-profit, community-based organization in Oakland that engages patients at Alameda Health System's Wilma Chan Highland Hospital, UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland and Sutter Health Eden Medical Center during the window of opportunity when patients are recovering after a violent injury. The three trauma hospitals provide direct services to the victims, while Youth ALIVE!'s Intervention Specialists provide emotional support, work to prevent retaliation, promote alternative strategies for dealing with conflicts, identify patients' short-term needs and help them develop plans to stay safe. Following hospital discharge, Intervention Specialists continue to provide case management and mentoring by peer role models

who assist youth with obtaining employment, high school diplomas, GEDs or college credits and link them to other resources to assist in building lifestyles free of violence.

In 1994, Youth ALIVE! established one of the first hospital-based violence intervention programs in the country in partnership with the Alameda County Emergency Medical Services Agency (ALCO EMS) and Highland Hospital. The program garnered national recognition as a prototype for effective violence intervention and has led to the formation of the National Network of Hospital-based Violence Intervention Programs. In 1999, then Attorney General Janet Reno selected Caught in the Crossfire as a violence intervention model to be replicated throughout the country.

ALCO EMS has contracted with Youth ALIVE! since 2008 for Caught in the Crossfire counseling services for Alameda County youth. On July 11, 2023, your Board approved the most current CBO Master Contract Amendment with Youth ALIVE! (Item No. 30). In the Fiscal Year 2023-2024, Youth ALIVE! has identified 340 participants and referred 218 of them to services, which include case management, local counseling resources, vocational or other job application assistance, mental health services and housing.

Approval of the amendment and extension of this contract would allow Youth ALIVE! to continue to provide services and Alameda County Health, Public Health Department (ACPHD) to complete a procurement through the Request for Proposal (RFP #ACPHD-OVP-1017) released on 4/5/24 to select a provider for the next contract scheduled to begin 10/1/24.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Youth ALIVE! is the most experienced and capable program to provide successful violence intervention services for youth in conjunction with the County's three trauma hospitals. With over 25 years of experience in violence prevention, Youth ALIVE! is a national leader in the field and trains other violence intervention staff throughout the country.

Since 1991, Youth ALIVE! has worked to help violently wounded people heal themselves and their community through their mission of preventing violence and creating young leaders. With the support of the City of Oakland and in partnership with Highland Hospital for over 25 years, Youth ALIVE! has served thousands of patients. Based upon that track record, in 2008 Youth ALIVE! entered into a contract with Alameda County to expand their reach beyond Oakland. Through the years, the program's original scope has been expanded to include the additional trauma hospitals and a broader service area. Selecting an established contractor eliminated the need to create a new program from the ground up and enabled Youth ALIVE! to quickly expand the number of Alameda County youth served.

On July 11, 2023, your Board approved a Resolution to waive the County's competitive bidding process for this contract as a Sole Source exemption request for Youth ALIVE! was denied by General Services Agency on 3/22/23 (Item No. 30). Alameda County Health, Public Health Department (ACPHD) is currently conducting a formal RFP #ACPHD-OVP-1017 to select a provider

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to continue these services with a contract start date of 10/1/24. Youth ALIVE! is a non-profit organization, and is exempt from the Small, Local and Emerging Business (SLEB) requirement.

FINANCING

Funding for this recommendation (\$53,454) comes from Senate Bill (SB) 12, the Maddy Emergency Medical Services Fund, and is included in the AC Health FY 2024-2025 Approved Budget. Approval of the recommendations will have no impact on net County cost.

VISION 2026 GOAL

Providing hospital-based violence intervention counseling to youth and young adults meets the 10x goal pathways of **Healthcare for All** and a **Crime Free County** in support of our shared vision of a **Thriving and Resilient Population**.

COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION MASTER CONTRACT AMENDMENT COVERSHEET

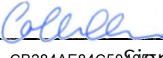
This First Amendment to Procurement Contract (“First Amendment”) is made by the County of Alameda (“County”) and Youth Alive hereinafter referred to as the (“Contractor”), with respect to Master Contract No. 900522, Procurement Contract No. 25473, (hereinafter “Procurement Contract”), including any and all prior amendments to the Procurement Contract.

For valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, County and Contractor agree to amend the Procurement Contract in the following respects:

- I. Except as otherwise stated in this First Amendment, the term of the Agreement shall be modified from “July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024” to “July 1, 2023 - September 30, 2024”, an extension of three months.
- II. The attached Exhibit A-1, Program Description and Performance Requirements supplements the original Exhibit A, Program Description and Performance Requirements and is hereby incorporated into the Procurement Contract by this reference.
- III. The attached Exhibit B-1, Additional Terms of Payment, supplements the original Exhibit B, Payment Terms and is hereby incorporated into the Procurement Contract by this reference.
- IV. The County shall pay Contractor an additional amount not to exceed fifty-three thousand, four hundred fifty-nine dollars (\$53,459). The not to exceed amount is therefore amended and increased from two hundred thirteen thousand, eight hundred thirty-five dollars (\$213,835) to two hundred sixty-seven thousand, two hundred ninety-four dollars (\$267,294) over the term of the Agreement and this First Amendment for any or all services under this Procurement Contract, including any and all amendments.
- V. The attached Exhibit E-1, Audit Report Requirements, is incorporated into the Procurement Contract.
- VI. DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION CERTIFICATION:
 - a. By signing this First Amendment and Exhibit D-1, Debarment and Suspension Certification, which is attached and incorporated in to this Procurement Contract by this reference, Contractor agrees to comply with applicable federal suspension and debarment regulations, including but not limited to 7 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 246.3, 246.4, 246.6, 248.3, 248.22; 24 CFR 200.31, 1003.608; 28 CFR 83.630, 83.670, 29 CFR 95.13, 97.35, 1470.35; 34 CFR 84.630, 84.670, 206.4, 222.19, 225.3, 226.3, 270.6, 280.3, 303.3, 350.4; 45 CFR 75.205, 75.213, 630.630, 630.670, 1325.9, 1329.3, 1330.2, 1355.30, 1370.3, and Executive Orders 12549 and 12689.
 - b. By signing this First Amendment, Contractor certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals:
 - i. Are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntary excluded by any federal department or agency;
 - ii. Shall not knowingly enter into any covered transaction with a person who is proposed for debarment under federal regulations, debarred, suspended, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in such transaction.
- VII. Except as expressly modified by this First Amendment, all of the terms and conditions of the Procurement Contract are and remain in full force and effect.

The Contractor continues to be bound by all provisions of the Master Contract. IN WITNESS WHEREOF and for valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, County and Contractor hereto have executed this First Amendment to Procurement Contract, effective as of the date of execution by the County. By signing below, signatory warrants and represents that he/she executed this First Amendment to Procurement Contract in his/her authorized capacity and that by his/her signature on this First Amendment to Procurement Contract, he/she or the entity upon behalf of which he/she acted, executed this First Amendment to Procurement Contract.

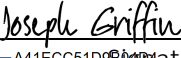

Youth ALIVE! will provide Caught in the Crossfire hospital-based Violence Intervention Services to up to 250 youth and young adults from Alameda County being treated for violent injuries at Highland Hospital/ Alameda Health System, UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland or Eden Medical Center. These Services will include hospital-based peer intervention, mentoring, case management and mental health services to consenting clients per the description below, with specific objectives and reporting requirements as set on this Exhibit A.

III. **Contract Deliverables and Requirements**

Without limiting any other obligation or liability under this Agreement, the Contractor, at its sole cost and expense, shall secure and keep in force during the entire term of the Agreement or longer, as may be specified below, the following minimum insurance coverage, limits and endorsements:

REDUCTION OR LIMIT OF OBLIGATION: All insurance policies, including excess and umbrella insurance policies, shall include an endorsement and be primary and non-contributory and will not seek contribution from any other insurance (or self-insurance) available to the County. The primary and non-contributory endorsement shall be at least as broad as ISO Form 20 01 04 13. Pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement insurance effected or procured by the Contractor shall not reduce or limit Contractor's contractual obligation to indemnify and defend the Indemnified Parties. INSURER FINANCIAL RATING: Insurance shall be maintained through an insurer with a A.M. Best Rating of no less than A:VII or equivalent, shall be admitted to the State of California unless otherwise waived by Risk Management, and with deductible amounts acceptable to the County. Acceptance of Contractor's insurance by County shall not relieve or decrease the liability of Contractor hereunder. Any deductible or self-insured retention amount or other similar obligation under the policies shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor. SUBCONTRACTORS: Contractor shall include all subcontractors as an insured (covered party) under its policies or shall verify that the subcontractor, under its own policies and endorsements, has complied with the insurance requirements in this Agreement, including this Exhibit. The additional Insured endorsement shall be at least as broad as ISO Form Number CG 20 38 04 13. JOINT VENTURES: If Contractor is an association, partnership or other joint business venture, required insurance shall be provided by one of the following methods: - Separate insurance policies issued for each individual entity, with each entity included as a "Named Insured" (covered party), or at minimum named as an "Additional Insured" on the other's policies. Coverage shall be at least as broad as in the ISO Forms named above. - Joint insurance program with the association, partnership or other joint business venture included as a "Named Insured". CANCELLATION OF INSURANCE: All insurance shall be required to provide thirty (30) days advance written notice to the County of cancellation. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE: Before commencing operations under this Agreement, Contractor shall provide Certificate(s) of Insurance and applicable insurance endorsements, in form and satisfactory to County, evidencing that all required insurance coverage is in effect. The County reserves the rights to require the Contractor to provide complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies. 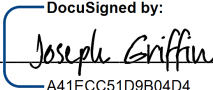
