- Allow private security to patrol at night and during events with RVs in lieu of previously required sheriff presence;
- Overnight RVs are permitted, subject to previous conditions imposed, for a maximum of two weekends;
- Exterior lights out on RVs at 11:00 pm;
- No spectators or racing participants on the Altamont Motorsports Park premises before 7:30 am and no racing engine activity before 9:30 am;
- Vendors are allowed to arrive one day prior to the event to set up;
- All activity, racing, clean up and exiting the premises will be concluded by 7 pm in April and September, 8:00 pm in May, June, July and August and 6 pm in October, this means the Altamont Motorsports Park will be shut down before sunset in every racing month.
- 86db at 100' from the edge of the track with the reading taken from the center of the track pointing the meter at the start finish line; it is very important that the reading be taken from the center of the track and not outside it; if a car fails to meet this reading it is removed from the track and is not allowed to compete;
- 83db at the property line; it is very important that this is monitored throughout the entire race program, not just early in the program when just one car is on the track; most every track is monitoring the property line nearest the track;
- Event/racing days remain at 28 as proposed by the Planning Commission but this includes all practices, races and other events on the track; the only exceptions to this would be the Act Real Behind the Wheel program and 5 days additional are approved to work with University programs;
- No alcohol or drugs are permitted in the pit area-zero tolerance; any competitor, including race team members caught with alcohol or illegal drugs in the pit area will be suspended for one year from the time of the violation; all drug activity will be reported to the proper law enforcement authorities;
- Environmental Health Department, Sheriff's Department and Community Development Agency Zoning Enforcement can use escalating fines for each documented violation starting at \$500, then \$1000, \$1500 and \$2000 of the BOS action, that are not being followed by the Altamont Motorsports Park, until compliance is met;
- The permit is concluded on October 15, 2008.
