I. Approval of Minutes - November 2014 minutes

II. Update on Canyon Lands Garbage Collection

Liz McElligott, Assistant Deputy Director, Alameda County Community Development Agency, presented a memorandum regarding Solid Waste Collection in the Castro Valley Canyonlands.

Waste Management of Alameda County notified residents in the Canyonlands of Castro Valley that they would discontinue solid waste collection services to that area as of March 31, 2015. Since that time, Supervisor Nate Miley, County staff, members of the Castro Valley Municipal Advisory Council, Castro Valley Sanitary District (CV San), Stop Waste and The Alameda Local Agency Formation Council (LAFCo) have been working to find an alternative to solid waste collection, without interruption of service.

Several options for waste collection were considered, and it was concluded that annexation of the Canyonlands to the CV San District would be the most beneficial for residents. The annexation would be implemented through a LAFCo process.

Roland Williams, General Manager, Castro Valley Sanitary District, reported that CV San has had three (3) meetings where this issue has been discussed. In the January meeting, the Board passed a resolution in support of Alameda County moving forward with the annexation, required by LAFCo to provide solid waste collection service in the Canyon Lands.

Proposed Rates for Castro Valley Sanitary District

20 gallon can - \$23.80 per month

32 gallon can - \$36.92 per month

64 gallon can - \$64.11 per month

96 gallon can - \$91.33 per month

Mona Palacios, Executive Director, LAFCo, explained the LAFCo process of annexation and fielded questions from community members. The LAFCo Board has received the application for the annexation of the Canyonlands into the Castro Valley Sanitary District.

The Commission will consider the application at their March 12, 2015 meeting. If approved, there will be a protest hearing at least twenty-one (21) days from the date of the notice of approval.

This item was informational only and required no Council action.

This meeting was adjourned to March 16, 2015.
