Karyn Tribble, PsyD, LSCW, Deputy Director, Behavioral Health Care Services and Randy Morris, LCSW, Assistant Agency Director, Social Services Agency, presented a PowerPoint presentation on the BHCS Assisted Outpatient Treatment, Community Conservatorship and In-Home Outreach Team Update.

In-Home Outreach Team (IHOT)

Outreach, engagement and linkage for people with severe mental illness who are not connected with services. There have been five (5) referrals to the IHOT program as of July 14, 2016.

Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT)

Full Service Partnership (FSP) level services for individuals who have a documented severe mental illness, who are not actively engaged in care, are in deteriorating condition, and have a history of failing to comply with treatment. There have been six (6) referrals to the AOT program as of July 2016.

Community Conservatorship (CC)

LPS conservatorship provided in the community rather than a locked facility. There have been two (2) referrals to the Community Conservatorship as of July 2014.
