The Community Capitals Model emerged from the Sheriff's Office effort to capture the relationships among the many interrelated resources that create a healthy community. The Alameda County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) and Deputy Sheriffs' Activities League (DSAL) use this model to look at all the interdependent elements that allow a community to thrive, seeing them as part of broad systems rather than disparate programs and services, and therefore better target investment.
