David Rocha, Fire Chief, Alameda County Fire Department, presented a PowerPoint presentation on the Department's Capital Facilities needs and Financing Options.

The presentation included information on current station conditions and capital facilities needs totaling \$97.18 million dollars.

The Fire Department and a municipal advisor developed a plan to finance capital facilities needs by a bond measure to be approved by voters. The Fire Department will conduct a voter opinion survey, finalize draft ballot measure language and adopt a resolution calling for a bond election and deliver the resolution to the Registrar of Voters by December 2019 to prepare for the March 3, 2020 election.

II. California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation (CDCR) Warm Handoff Developing Therapeutic Transitions for Successful Reentry <u>Attachment</u>

Karen Baker, Assistant Chief Probation Officer, and Wendy Still, Chief Probation Officer, Alameda County Probation Department, presented PowerPoint on the Probation Departments Pilot to Positive Re-entry.

The Pilot to Positive Re-Entry is a collaboration between the California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation and the Alameda County probation department to improve the pre-release, assessment and planning process to facilitate a seamless transition to community supervision, The target population includes adult male and female clients with a history of violent offenses, to include those with convictions for sex offenses, domestic violence and significant mental health issues.

Desired outcomes include reduced recidivism, providing a sustainable living wage, and higher success rates for clients returning to the community.
