WIOA Program Performance Outcomes - Adults

- 631 Enrolled into WIOA Title I program
- \$433,302 Invested in occupational training
- 87 Participants earned industry credentials
- 94.5% of Participants on average were placed into priority industries and occupations
- 314 Participants entered employment

Special COVID-19 Grants

Supportive Services Grant - \$153k COVID Emergency Response Supportive Services (CERSS) Grant has served 140 people and provided \$75,049 of financial assistance. The program runs through 12/31/2020.

 $National\ Dislocated\ Worker\ Program\ -\ HEROS\ -\ \$400,\!000\ in\ National\ Dislocated\ Worker\ Grant\ funds,\\ locally\ the\ program\ is\ called\ Health\ Emergency\ Response\ Occupational\ Stimulus\ (HEROS)\ Grant$ 

- Upcoming partnership with the Alameda County Community Food Bank to provide subsidized employment opportunities, by hiring Food Insecurity Workers to maintain emergency Oakport site operational through the holiday season
- \$20/hour for up to 520 hours of work through the end of March 2021

In This Together (ITT) Grant - \$300,000 ITT Grant in progress to enhance employer services and better assist small businesses impacted by COVID-19, with an employer hotline as a primary strategy. Efforts will be focused on identifying at-risk businesses for the rapid deployment of employer resources.
