Director Noel Gallo called into order the Meeting of the Board of Directors at 9:34 A.M.

3.1 Meeting Minutes for October 23, 2025

4) **Director's Report**

Director Igor Tregub arrived at agenda item #4.

Secretary April Williamson stated staff are finalizing the analysis from the polling consultants working on the CSA ballot measure. The Department anticipates a presentation to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors and their direction. The Department will return to this Board with a full briefing on recommended next steps at a future meeting.

Ms. Williamson informed Directors that the Department is partnering with Alameda County Public Health Department on a \$4.6 million grant proposal for a climate resiliency demonstration project. The grant application proposal will include weatherization, electrification, mold, lead hazard remediation, indoor air quality improvements, extreme heat/cooling mitigation and energy-efficiency upgrades centered in the unincorporated area of Alameda County. Director Igor Tregub recommended regional organizations in workforce development, Alameda County Building Construction Council and City of Berkeley for participation in the climate resiliency demonstration project grant application.

Ms. Williamson stated the Department is in the process of redesigning its website. This upgrade is part of an Agency-wide initiative to streamline navigation across the departments with clearer and more intuitive experience. The new website redesign is expected to be finalized in the summer or fall of 2026.

Additionally, the Department is increasing outreach and providing information to contractors about how to participate in our programs. This is an effort to grow a stable contractor pipeline to sustain contractor participation and support a diverse local workforce.

Ms. Williamson reminded Directors that the next JPA Lead Board meeting will be at the Department office located at 2000 Embarcadero Suite 300 Oakland on December 18th.

Director Tracy Jensen asked staff to consider participating in a technical advisory committee formed by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District and CalTrans on the I-580-Freeway Truck Study. The study aims at evaluating the impacts (traffic, health, environment, equity) of potentially removing the long-standing ban on large trucks between Oakland and San Leandro.

5) **Monthly Report**

Lidice De La Fuente highlighted literature distribution of lead poisoning prevention information and collaboration with Eden Area Communities.

6) **ACHHD Health Services Overview Presentation**

Katie Gulyas, Director of Operations, presented on the Department's Health Services unit.

Director Jensen expressed concerns over aviation lead and its impact on nearby residents in Bay Farm Island in Alameda. Ms. Gulyas indicated that while the Department does not have jurisdiction over Oakland Airport, the Department is working on an initiative with local public schools to require blood lead testing. Director Nate Miley recommended staff present to the Alameda County Health Committee and collaborate with the Alameda County Department of Education regarding the proposed school blood lead testing initiative.

Ms. Gulyas noted the City of Berkeley opted out of the contract with the State for childhood lead poisoning prevention services. Therefore, the California Department of Public Health responds to lead poisoning prevention cases for the City of Berkeley. The Department collaborates with City of Berkeley Code Enforcement Department on unsafe lead renovation complaints and conditions.

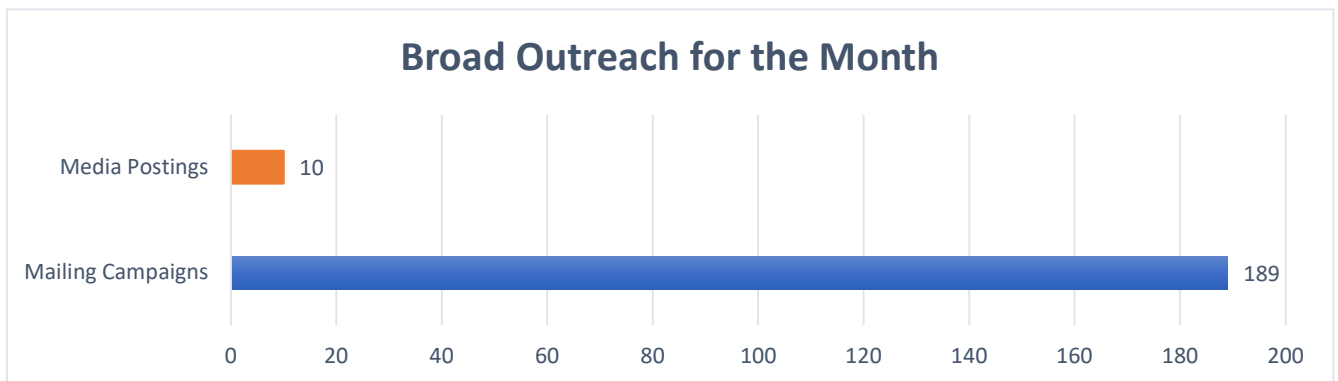
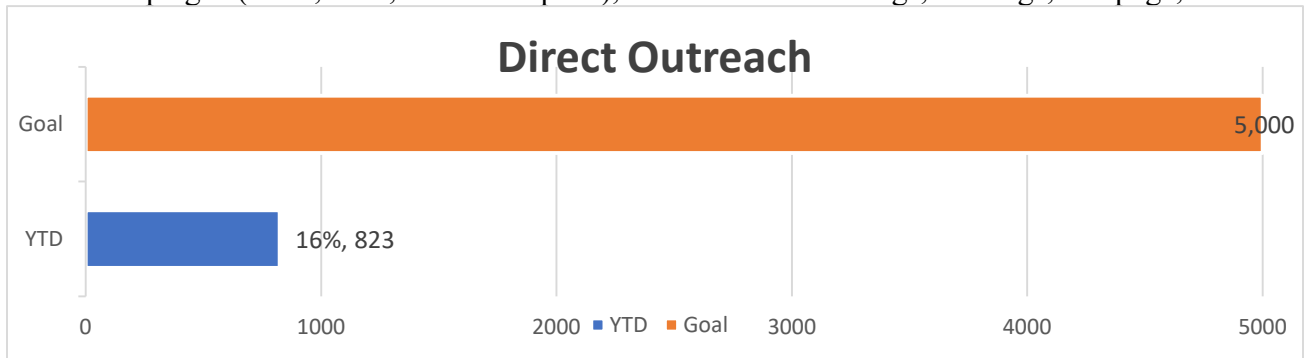

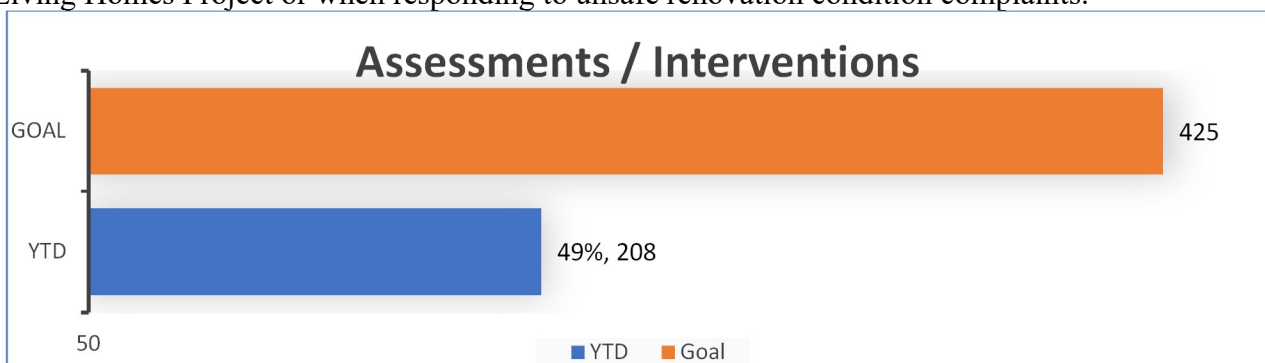
Public Outreach

By June 30, 2026, Alameda County residents will be reached and informed of CSA property owner services, lead safety, childhood lead poisoning prevention, training, maintaining a lead-safe property, minor home repair and the impact of housing on health. Direct outreach to an estimated 5,000 residents will be done through community events such as presentations, information booths, training, and lead consultations, etc. An estimated 500 thousand individuals will be reached through multi-media campaigns (radio, T.V., social and print), collaboration meetings, mailings, webpage, etc.



Healthy Housing Assessments/Interventions

By June 30, 2026, a total of 425 healthy housing assessments / interventions will be conducted in the homes of Alameda County residents participating in the Lead Hazard Control Program, Lead Poisoning Prevention Program, Minor Home Repair programs, Fixing to Stay and Independent Living Homes Project or when responding to unsafe renovation condition complaints.
