Director Noel Gallo called into order the Meeting of the Board of Directors at 9:30 A.M.

3) **Consent Items**

3.1 Meeting Minutes for May 22, 2025

Action: The Board approved the meeting minutes for May 22, 2025.

Director Tregub arrived at agenda item #3.

4) **Director's Report**

Secretary April Williamson provided a funding update informing Directors that Department staff are monitoring the development of Federal funding. The Department staff will return to this Board should any of these decisions affect the Healthy Homes Department funding impacting the Department's minor home repair programs.

Ms. Williamson stated the Department ran a successful healthy homes and lead awareness campaign in the month of May with billboard ads and posters on BART, on busy transit corridors and walkable areas throughout Alameda County reaching 3.6 million views.

In response to the Board's request from the previous month, Department staff are preparing a comprehensive presentation on its school outreach strategy and coordinated efforts with local code enforcement agencies. This presentation will be scheduled for an upcoming Board meeting within the next few months.

Ms. Williamson presented a case summary involving a lead poisoned child and the cross coordination of agencies including Department's Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program, City of Oakland Code Enforcement and Oakland Unified School District. The coordination of these agencies ensured a timely abatement of the identified hazards, repairs and stabilization of peeling paint to protect students and staff and the corrective actions

leading to the child's blood lead levels steadily declining from a high of 24.8µg/dL to 4.4 µg/dL., demonstrating the effectiveness of the coordinated investigation and remediation efforts.

Ms. Williamson stated the Department staff, Oakland City Manager and the Equitable Lead Hazard Abatement Program Planning working group will resume meeting on the lead settlement discussions on Monday, June 30, 2025.

Vice Chair, Valerie Arkin, asked for information on lead settlement funding spent outside of the city of Oakland.

Ms. Williamson distributed "Nora Knows About Lead", a book written and illustrated by Department staff. The Department intends to distribute the book in local libraries and partnering organizations.

5) **Selection of Community Representative**

Secretary Williamson announced that Gwen Hardy who served as the Community Representative on the JPA Lead Board, resigned her appointment as the JPA Community Representative. Ms. Williamson thanked Ms. Hardy for over 32 years of service.

Deputy Secretary, Lidice De La Fuente, will provide Directors with information on the JPA Lead Board agreement referencing the selection of the community representative, a description of the Lead Board of Directors and next steps for the Board to make nominations. The selection of the community representative agenda item was proposed as an action item for the September 25th meeting.

6) **Monthly Report**

Ms. De La Fuente highlighted the National Science Foundation Day event in Berkeley that occurred in May.

7) **Future Agenda Items**

Vice Chair, Arkin asked for information on lead settlement fund expenditures. Director Igor Tregub asked Department staff to share future community events with Directors. Chair, Noel Gallo and Director Tracy Jensen asked staff for additional case review presentations at future meetings showcasing site visits, lead paint, and the coordination of services with hospitals/medical providers around lead poisoned children.

8) **Announcements by Board of Directors**

Vice Chair, Arkin announced that due to a scheduling conflict neither her nor Director Nate Miley will attend the September meeting.

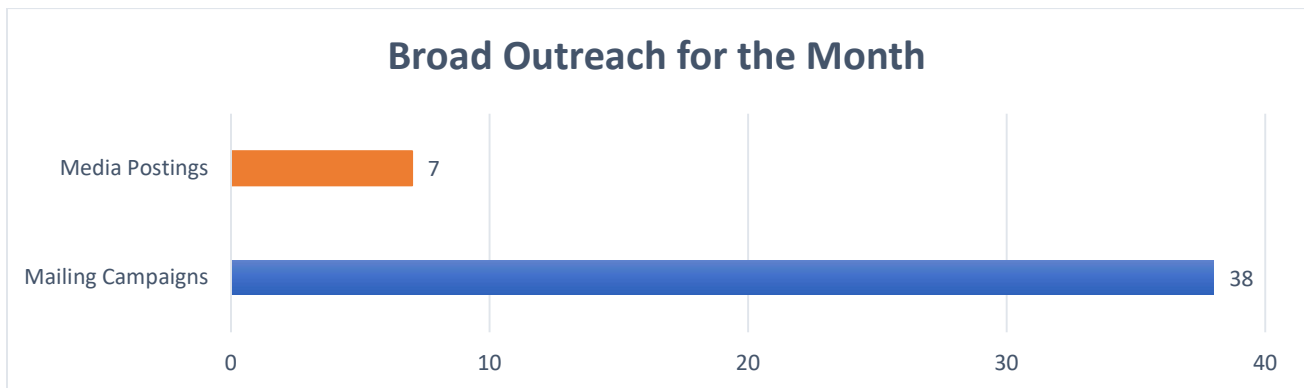
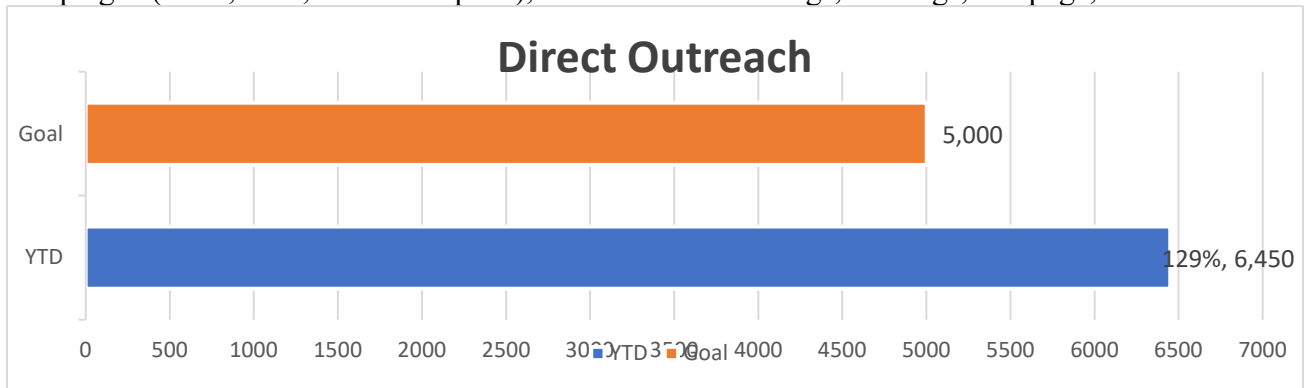

Report for June 2025

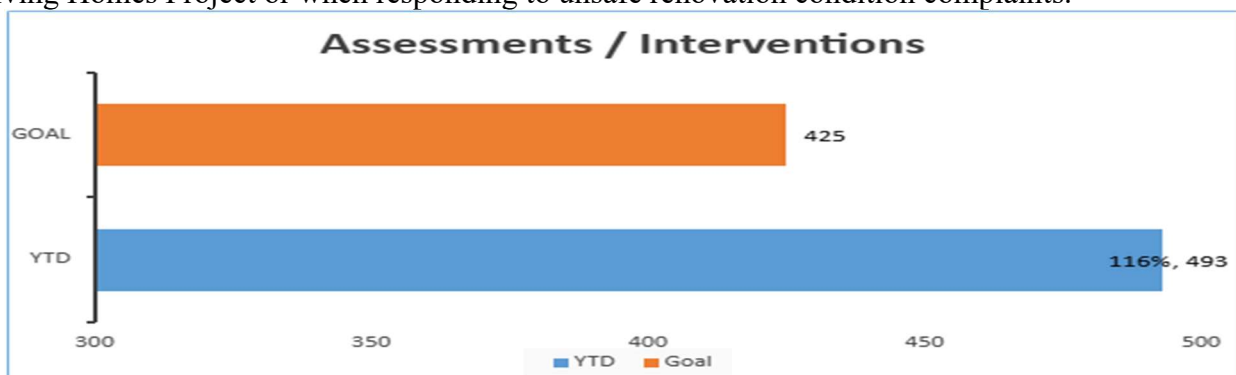
Public Outreach

By June 30, 2025, Alameda County residents will be reached and informed of CSA property owner services, lead safety, childhood lead poisoning prevention, training, maintaining a lead-safe property, minor home repair and the impact of housing on health. Direct outreach to an estimated 5,000 residents will be done through community events such as presentations, information booths, training, and lead consultations, etc. An estimated 1 million individuals will be reached through multi-media campaigns (radio, T.V., social and print), collaboration meetings, mailings, webpage, etc.



Healthy Housing Assessments/Interventions

By June 30, 2025, a total of 425 healthy housing assessments / interventions will be conducted in the homes of Alameda County residents participating in the Lead Hazard Control Program, Lead Poisoning Prevention Program, Minor Home Repair programs, Fixing to Stay and Independent Living Homes Project or when responding to unsafe renovation condition complaints.
