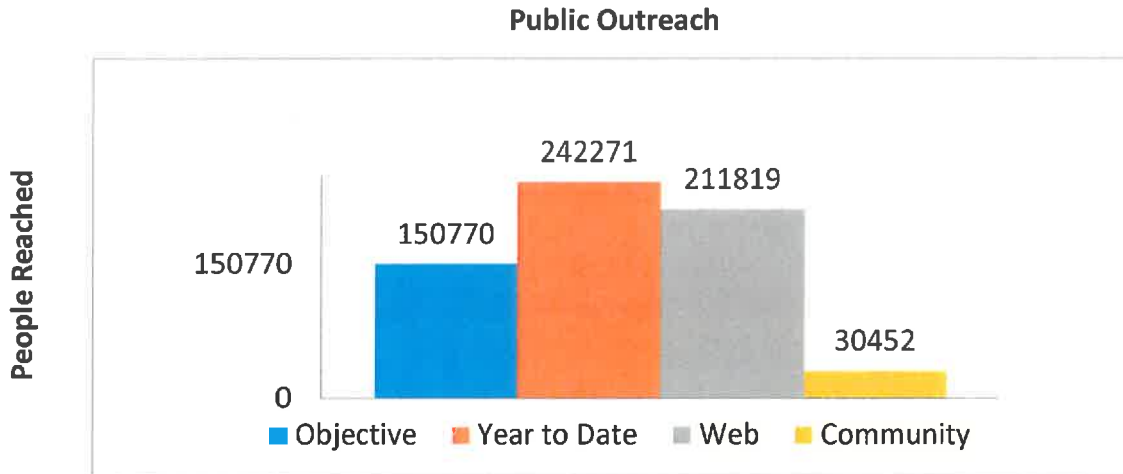

Public Outreach

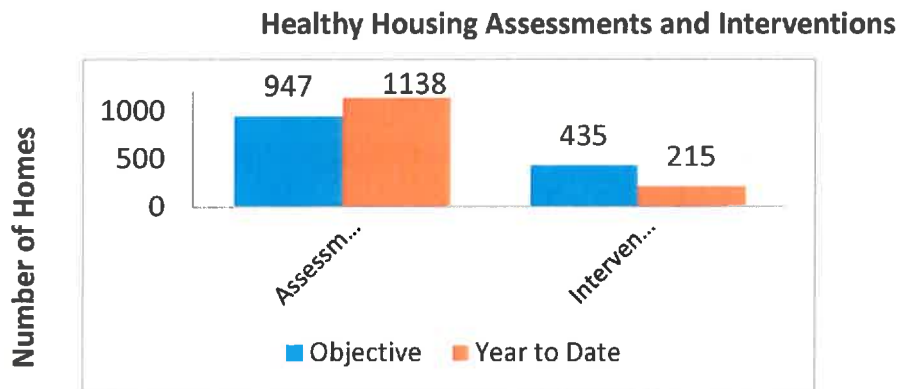

This objective will be completed through outreach events, phone consultations, publishing articles, conducting training, maintaining online visibility and developing partnerships with multiple organizations including rental industry, community clinics and advisory boards.
