Director John J. Bauters chaired the meeting at 9:17 A.M.

1) **Open Forum**

2) Director's Report

Secretary to the Board, Larry Brooks provided Directors with an update on the meeting with Oakland Unified School District officials resulting in the County Health Officer, Muntu Davis, M.D., directing all Alameda County school districts to notify parents of the need for children blood lead testing. Director Desley Brooks stated that Oakland Unified School District officials were also receptive to conducting children blood lead testing events in partnership with other non-profit organizations including the Alameda County Public Health Department. Lastly, a follow up meeting will be scheduled at which time JPA Directors will be invited. Director Brooks added that County Board Supervisor Chan is working on water station project with the goal of encouraging children to drink water as oppose to soft drinks.

Mr. Brooks informed Directors of a bill introduced by Assemblyman Chris Holden requiring universal blood lead testing for children attending childcare centers. Mr. Brooks will keep Directors abreast of any developments.

Mr. Brooks provided Directors with an update on the lead paint litigation indicating that the California Supreme Court refused to hear the case of the paint companies, therefore, they intend to file with the U.S. Supreme Court. Mr. Brooks stated he will keep Directors updated of any new developments.

3) Review of Goals and Objectives FY 17/18

Larry Brooks reported that the healthy home assessments and interventions in the JPA Goals and Objectives FY 17/18 were adjusted in the fall 2017 to reflect signed contractual agreements. The agreement with Alameda County Health Care Services Agency for the Fixing to Stay Project and Group Living Facilities for the incorporated and Unincorporated County added 205 healthy home assessments and 80 interventions; contractual agreements with city of Oakland and Union City for minor home repair and rehabilitation services added an additional 137 assessments for the fiscal year. Amended goal for fiscal year 2017-2018 is 947 healthy home assessments and 435 for healthy home interventions.

4) Outreach and Education Monthly Report

Lidice De La Fuente indicated the public outreach chart of the monthly report was separated as requested by Directors to reflect web outreach and face to face/over the phone interaction. Director Bauters thanked staff for the revisions.

The meeting was called to order by John J. Bauters at 9:27 A.M.

1) Open Forum

2) Director's Report

Larry Brooks announced the launch of Oakland's Civic Service Design Lab dedicated to training government staff and making public services for Oakland residents as effective and accessible. The Department staff will serve as technical experts on the proposed proactive rental inspection program.

Furthermore, Mr. Brooks stated that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), is in support of pending legislation regarding EPA's Renovate, Repair and Paint trainings. EPA will be sending out brochures to permitting offices in Region 9 encouraging offices to duplicate Emeryville's ordinance requiring RRP certification.

Additionally, as a result of last week hearings requiring lead testing at childcare centers Assemblyman Chris Holden introduced Assembly Bill 2370, which would expand lead testing in drinking water within childcare centers. The legislation also encourages greater lead testing of high risk children and requires parents be informed of risks and effects of lead exposure.

Mr. Brooks stated he had a scheduling conflict affecting the June 28th, 2018 JPA Meeting due to a mandatory U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Healthy Housing Conference in Anaheim, CA. Director Bauters asked to refer this item as an action item for the March 22, 2018 JPA meeting in order to discuss an alternative meeting date for June.

Mr. Brooks informed Directors that Director Gwen Hardy was proclaimed for her outstanding contributions to the community at Emeryville's Black History Month.
