RESOLUTION NO. 2022-___

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER 27, 2022

WHEREAS, the Ralph M. Brown Act (Gov. Code sections 54950 *et seq*.), requires the meetings of local legislative bodies to be open to the public; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the Board of Directors of the Alameda County Lead Poisoning Prevention Program Joint Powers Authority ("the Board of Directors") and its committees or subcommittees that are subject to the Brown Act are open to the public; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act allows meetings by teleconference, provided specified requirements are met; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, the Governor of the State of California issued a Proclamation of a State of Emergency declaring a state of emergency exists in California due to the threat of COVID-19, pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act (Government Code section 8625), which has not yet been lifted; and

WHEREAS, the Governor, toward the beginning of the state of emergency, issued executive orders suspending certain requirements of the Brown Act regarding teleconferencing; the Governor's suspension of Brown Act teleconferencing requirements expired on September 30, 2021, pursuant to Executive Order N-08-21; and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2021, the Governor signed into law AB 361, which amended the Brown Act to allow teleconferenced meetings under abbreviated teleconference procedures during a state of emergency (Gov. Code section 54953(e)); and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953(e), provides for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), during a state of emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, if certain conditions exist; and

WHEREAS, the conditions of Government Code section 54953(e) are that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or in the alternative, the legislative body holds a meeting to determine, or has already determined, by a majority vote that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Occupational Safety and Health of California's (Cal/OSHA) issued Emergency Temporary Standards that require employers to train and instruct employees that the use of social distancing helps combat the spread of COVID-19 (8 Cal. Code Regs. 3205(c)(5)(D).); and

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2021, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Alameda accepted the recommendation of the Health Care Services Agency Director for continued social distancing at all meetings of the full Board of Supervisors and at all Board of Supervisors Committee meetings; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1. All of the above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. The Board of Directors finds that state and local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing. The Board of Directors has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency and finds that state and local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

Section 3. The Board of Directors finds that as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees. The Board of Directors has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency and finds that the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person.

Section 4. The Board of Directors therefore determines that it and its legislative bodies shall conduct their meetings by teleconferencing in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e).

Section 5. This Resolution expires thirty (30) days after the date of its adoption only to the extent required by law. Otherwise, this Resolution shall remain in effect until repealed by the Board of Directors.

Director John J. Bauters called into order the teleconference for the Meeting of the Board of Directors at 9:06 A.M.

4) **Director's Report**

Director Malia Vella arrived at item #4.

Secretary to the Board, Larry Brooks, announced that the Department is the recipient of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Secretary's Award. Mr. Brooks and Assistant Deputy Director, Dale Hagen will accept the award at the HUD conference in Baltimore, MD on October 18, 2022. Directors congratulated staff and asked for a press release or bullet points to assist in getting the word out to the public. Director Noel Gallo congratulated staff and inquired about the Department's ten-year strategy for moving forward. Director John J. Bauters offered to assist with drafting the press release.

Lidice De La Fuente introduced the Department's two newest staff members, Hannah Wollo and Simon Yang, members of the Department's Health team and Education and Engagement team.

Mr. Brooks shared a presentation on the status of the lead settlement funds with the JPA Directors, which was originally requested by Alameda County Board of Supervisors, Nate Miley and David Haubert, for their Procurement and Contracting Committee. Mr. Brooks gave an overview of the lead settlement funds and highlighted activities promoting the

demand for lead safe maintenance and renovation, lead safety training, economic

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opportunities for various local vendors and community-based organizations, expanded and enhanced services to lead poisoned children and community engagement. Mr. Brooks stated that the City of Oakland is benefiting indirectly due to the Department contracting with local vendors and community-based organizations based in Oakland for the Department's logo, community engagement activities and lead safety training. Mr. Brooks noted that the forty percent of the funds dedicated to Oakland have not been spent and negotiations with the City have not resumed. Director Gallo asked for a copy of the presentation and indicated he would follow up with Oakland's negotiation team.

Mr. Brooks stated that Assembly Bill 838 went into effect on July 1, 2022, requiring cities and counties to respond to lead hazard related tenant complaints. Senate Bill 1076, supported by the California Code Enforcement Association will require all workers on pre-1978 housing take a one-day lead safety training. These two bills impact code enforcement statewide.

The Department has seen an uptick in children with elevated blood lead levels presuming due to the U.S. Center for Disease Control lowering the action level to 3.5 mcg/dl and coming out of the COVID-19 pandemic. Mr. Brooks noted that most recently three children and the mother were lead poisoned with two of the children having a blood lead level above 40 mcg/dl. According to staff this was the most complex case in the Department's history due to an uncooperative parent and thus requiring a multiagency response.

Mr. Brooks indicated that Oakland Code Enforcement responded to an apartment building with unpermitted demolition work in North Oakland in part due to AB 838 and Healthy Homes providing them with an overview of the new law and Lead Safe Work Practices.

5) July & August Monthly Reports

Lidice De La Fuente stated the Department made changes to the Department's website such as adding translation capability and making the Department's Programs more prominent. The Department presumes that these changes attributed to more visitors to the website and people staying longer.
