Director John J. Bauters called into order the teleconference for the Meeting of the Board of Directors at 9:37 A.M.

3.1 Meeting Minutes for June 22, 2023

4) Director's Report

Director Malia Vella arrived at item 4.

Secretary to the Board, Larry Brooks, presented a slideshow that highlighted June as Healthy Homes Awareness Month. Activities highlighted were outreach efforts done by the Department's Education and Engagement Team, including multiple in person events, live Twitter chats, email blasts, and community partner events.

Mr. Brooks stated that the Lead Settlement discussions with Oakland have resumed. He explained the settlement spending funds overview with Oakland and Lead Safe Alameda County. Director Noel Gallo asked for a copy of the slide presentation. Mr. Gallo noted he is glad the County and Oakland have resumed the meetings. He recommended the County, and the city look at other jurisdictions that are already doing the work and duplicate their programs. Mr. Brooks indicated that there's a lot of interest on how the lead settlement funds will be used and recommended he connect with Oakland's negotiation team to learn about Oakland's plan.

Furthermore, Mr. Brooks provided updated information on Oakland's Race Equity and Impact Assessment Overview highlighting Proactive Rental Inspections, Transparency and Oversight, Anti-displacement, and Workforce Development for Small Business.

Mr. Brooks informed the Board that the Department receives American Rescue Plan funds for rental minor home repair in the Unincorporated County and while it has been successful in reaching landlords, they're not interested in receiving services for repairing their rental properties. Mr. Brooks noted the 2016 tenant survey where tenants reported needing home repairs and being afraid of retaliatory actions. Director Malia Vella recommended sharing information with the Alameda County Board of Supervisors and partnering with tenant's right groups. Directors nominated Director Vella to represent the JPA Directors in working with staff to craft a letter to the County informing them of the challenges, circulating the letter to JPA Directors on bcc for individual Directors to edit and authorize the Chair to sign on behalf of the JPA Board.

5) Monthly Report

Lidice De La Fuente highlighted the outreach activities on social media, three RRP trainings, and the continued promotion of CSA services that include trainings, in home consultations, and paint kits. Ms. De La Fuente offered to meet with Directors to discuss outreach opportunities for getting the word out to eligible CSA property owners.

Director Gallo emphasized the need for the County and the City to look at other successful programs that they could duplicate. Mr. Brooks noted he would provide information about other programs funded by lead settlement funds in September.

Director John J. Bauters spoke about the importance and many health benefits of going outdoors, specifically how it personally connects you to the environment adding that he will be in the wilderness for 28 days in the summer.



Report for July & August 2023 Public Outreach

By June 30, 2024, Alameda County residents will be reached and informed of CSA property owner services, lead safety, childhood lead poisoning prevention, training, maintaining a lead-safe property, minor home repair and the impact of housing on health. Direct outreach to an estimated 5,000 residents will be done through community events such as presentations, information booths, trainings, and lead consultations, etc. An estimated 1 million individuals will be reached through multi-media campaigns (radio, T.V., social and print), collaboration meetings, mailings, webpage, etc.


