



State guidelines for EJ implementation:

- Identify actors responsible
- Specify **timelines**
- Include implementation programs that are responsive to and prioritize the needs of priority communities
- Identify mechanisms for monitoring (metrics, performance indicators)
- Incorporate transparent communication and reporting strategies to convey implementation status to stakeholders
- Establish systems to continue to involve and engage priority communities in implementation activities

Tools available for implementation?

Tools will depend on specific measures. Examples include:

- Ordinance or zoning amendments
- Adoption of subsequent policies consistent with EJ Element
- Investment in Capital Improvement Projects
- Grant funding to develop new programs
- Building EJ policies/programs into workplan and budgets
- Collaboration with non-county agencies and special districts
- Community-initiated action and activism

EJ Implementation Plan will include:

- Specific measures (policies and actions), with responsible actors, timelines, and prioritization of measures based on community/stakeholder input and feasibility (including cost)
- Monitoring mechanisms
- Communication and reporting strategies, including regular EJ implementation updates to BOS subcommittees, Planning Commission, and MACs
- Strategies for ongoing engagement of/accountability to Priority Communities in implementation
- A proposed structure for a collaborative body to guide EJ implementation



The Challenge:

Develop a stable, sustainable structure or body for EJ implementation


Example: ACHCC EJ Bucket could transition to an EJ Implementation Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)

Work of the EJ Implementation body could include:

- Supporting lead implementing agencies through ongoing coordination and exchange of ideas
- Monitoring and communicating progress to stakeholders
- Ensuring accountability for ongoing engagement of Priority Communities in Implementation
- More?

Prompts for group discussion:

- What ideas do you have for the structure of the implementation body?
- Who is involved?
- How often does body meet?
- Who organizes and facilitates meetings? (lead: Planning)
- What encourages accountability of various actors, agencies, departments?
- How are County actors encouraged to participate? How are non-County actors encouraged to participate? What would make this body worthwhile for you and your agency?
- How is community involved, engaged, and informed?
- Is there a website? Social media? Who manages them? (lead: Planning)
- Are there regular report outs to MACs, Unincorporated Service, Planning Commission, BOS? What's the timeline? (lead: Planning)
