



"Civic Engagement" vs "Community Engagement"



Superstructure: Policies, mechanisms, relationships, social contract that allow for involvement in civic and political life in the community

Project-specific, hyper-local, outreach tools and tactics employed to build social capital and encourage involvement in problem solving and community and civic life

An SB 1000-compliant EJ Element must:


 Identify objectives and policies to promote Civic Engagement in priority communities

 Include recommendations to facilitate and promote the ongoing engagement of priority communities

 Include metrics to evaluate progress and assess effectiveness

SB 1000 and Civic Engagement:

- Civic Engagement should be viewed as an ongoing process
- Work to build relationships and trust by:
 - Acknowledging past harms
 - Understanding local history
- Develop engagement strategies that consider:
 - Diversity
 - External barriers
 - Clear communication



Recent structural changes to increase Civic Engagement:

- My Eden Voice!
- Ashland Community Association
- Eden Area Municipal Advisory Council (MAC)
- Reorganization of ACHCC
- Strengthened Latine parent groups: Padres Unidos, Padres Guerreros
- Placemaking efforts (signage, murals, events)
- Currently in process:
 - Translation at public meetings
 - Tenant protection work
 - USPS place names (ZIP code project)
 - BOS acknowledgement of past harms; reparations

 Unincorporated communities feel overlooked, left out, not prioritized

 Lack of government accountability; community feedback not taken seriously

 Outreach methods and meeting structures inaccessible to some populations

Community members feel insufficiently informed about meetings
