AB 47 (McCarty) Amended 7/2	Fund Universal Preschool for all income eligible children.	Support To Governor
AB 74 (Calderon) Amended 9/2/15	Phases in annual licensed child care centers and family child care homes annual unannounced site visits starting January 1, 2018. Current law requires Licensing to conduct inspections in all licensed child care centers and licensed family child care homes once every five years.	Support To Governor
AB 188 (Garcia)	Existing law requires reimbursement for alternative payment programs to include the cost of child care paid to child care providers plus the administrative and support services costs of the alternative payment program, as provided, and limits the total cost for administration and support services to an amount not to exceed 17.5% of the total contract amount. This bill would also require alternative payment programs to be reimbursed for making eligibility determinations at a rate of three percent of the total contract amount.	Support Senate Not moving
AB 762 (Mullin) Amended 7/16	Expands the age range of the childcare optional toddler component. Specifically, this bill: 1) Increases the upper age limit for optional toddler programs authorized by the Department of Social Services (DSS) from 30 months to three years of age. 2) Directs infant and preschool-age day care centers with an optional toddler program to, beginning January 1, 2016, extend the toddler component to serve children up to three years old. The Senate amendments apply the extension of the upper age limit of optional toddler programs to child care centers serving preschool-age children.	Support To Governor
AB 765 (Ridley-Thomas)	Requires the COLA for State Contracted Child Development programs to be at least equal to the amount of the inflation adjustment applied to K-12 school district revenue limits, as specified, essentially raising the SRR	Support Not moving
AB 833 Bonta	Alameda County pilot to have more administrative flexibility for State Contracted Title 5 programs to accommodate high cost of living. Modeled on San Francisco and San Mateo pilots that are under way.	Support/Sponsor/ Governor
SB 311 (Beall, Wiecowski) 7/6	Alum Rock School District in Santa Clara County pilot to use free or reduced lunch to determine Preschool eligibility and other flexibility in order to provide full day preschool for certain students.	Support Not moving
SB 548 (Deleon and Atkins) 6/1	Requires four hours training for family child care providers, to be provided by unions. Requires provider lists to be sent to unions.	Watch To Governor
SB 567 (Liu)	Provides that children who receive child care subsidies through state contracted programs will be considered to meet all eligibility requirements and will receive assistance for not less than 12 months	Support Not moving
SB 763 (Leno) 7/8	Senate Bill 763 will mandate children's product manufactures to disclose on a label whether or not their products contain toxic flame retardant chemicals. It is a disclosure bill that is an extension of SB 1019 (Leno) that focuses on children's products like bassinets, nap mats, and nursing pillows	Support Not moving
