Re: Relocation Notification

Thank you Daphna for notifying Alameda County Early Care and Education Planning Council about Building Blocks upcoming move of its CSPP Fall 2017. In reviewing Alameda County zip code priorities, your current program location is identified as Priority #1 located at **2370 Grande Vista Place, Oakland, CA 94601** for two CSPP classrooms (Lady Bugs and Bumble Bees). Both classrooms reflect 8 enrolled children with a license capacity of 18.

Building Blocks **new** location will be **3695 High Street, Oakland, CA 94619** and its current enrollment and licensing capacity will remain the same for both CSPP classrooms listed above. However, this new location is not a priority area identified by the Planning Council for CSPP children. It is a Priority #2 area for CCCTR (infants/toddlers and school age) children. With this said, your new location is outside of Alameda County's identified zip code priority areas as reflected below:

Per our conversation on July 19, 2017, it is my understanding this move does allow Building Blocks to expand its non-public Kindergarten- 3rd educational program. Historically, we have not approved or disapproved of programs relocating from one area of the county to another. The Planning Council has advocated for increasing and maintaining slots in identified priority zip code areas. Nonetheless, it is very helpful for the Planning Council to be aware of where we need to increase child care slots so that we can plan and target/allocate resources accordingly to support access to quality early care and education programs.
