Be careful in the Summer Heat!

Extremely hot weather can be very harmful to many people – it can be just as bad -- or worse -- than the cold.

Symptoms of Heat-Related Illness: Extremely high body temperature (103°+), difficulty breathing, red hot dry skin (no sweating), dizziness, fatigue, rapid pulse, nausea, confusion, faintness, headaches, muscle cramps, unconsciousness.

If you experience these symptoms seek medical attention.

Be Careful! Heat and sun are threats to aging folks, babies and children, disabled persons, folks with medical conditions or who take medication, and folks who drink or use drugs.

Be Aware! Check on your neighbors. If you see someone passed out or in bad shape, they could be suffering or dying from heat and sun. Check in with them, and see if they are OK. If needed, call 911 and get them help!

Wellness Checks! Outreach agencies and concerned neighbors should reach out to people that they know could be at risk. Bring water, and check in with folks to make sure that they are ok in the heat.

Water! People on the streets don't have ready access to water. It is both compassionate and useful to provide bottled water to people, in addition to sunscreen, hats and umbrellas for protection.

Animals! Pets will suffer from heat, give them shade to rest in and plenty of water.

Cooling Center! A cooling center is a facility, such as a senior center, community center or library, where people may go to get out of life-threatening heat during a heat wave. Cooling centers are for everyone, especially those at risk of getting a heat-related illness.
