SUBJECT: AWARD CONTRACTS FOR AB109 REALIGNMENT DIRECT SERVICE GRANTS: EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICES, REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL NO. 901453, AMOUNT: \$4,000,000

RECOMMENDATION:

- A. Approve and authorize the Chief Probation Officer to execute Master CBO contract for RFP No. 901453, Procurement Contract No. 13978, with San Francisco Sheriff's Department Five Keys Charter Schools and Programs (Principal: Steve Good; Location: San Francisco), to provide AB109 realignment education services to the Alameda County Probation Department, for the approximate term of 08/02/16 – 08/01/18, in the amount of \$1,000,000; and
- B. Approve and authorize the Chief Probation Officer to execute Master CBO contracts for RFP No. 901453, to provide AB109 realignment employment services to the Alameda County Probation Department, for the approximate term of 08/02/16 – 08/01/18, in the pooled amount of \$3,000,000, with the following pool of vendors:
 - 1. Procurement Contract No. 13979, with America Works of California, Inc. (Principal: Sidharth Mishra; Location: San Francisco); and
 - 2. Procurement Contract No. 13980, with Building Opportunities for Self-Sufficiency (Principal: Donald Frazier; Location: Berkeley).

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

The Public Safety Realignment Act (Realignment or Act) took effect October 1, 2011 and mandated extensive changes to California's criminal justice systems. Realignment shifted the responsibility for supervising specific low-level inmates and parolees from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to each of the 58 counties. This Act tasked local government at the county level with developing a new approach to reducing recidivism.

Each county was directed to create a Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) to develop and recommend to the county Board of Supervisors a county implementation plan for 2011 Public Safety Realignment. The Alameda County Board of Supervisors (BOS) adopted the initial *Implementation Plan (2011)*, the *Year Two Plan (2012)*, and the *Year Three Public Safety Realignment Plan (2013)*. The Act also established an Executive Committee of the CCP members.

On July 28, 2015, the BOS approved funding for community-based organizations (CBO) to provide services under five service domains as follows: education, employment, case management, For Us By Us, and pre-trial services. Other Request for Proposals (RFP) will address case management, pre-trial services, and peer supports (referred to as For Us By Us).

SELECTION CRITERIA/PROCESS:

The Alameda County Probation Department (ACPD) has determined that the County does not currently have the resources to provide education and employment services.

The ACPD worked with General Services Agency (GSA)-Procurement to develop and issue an RFP which was issued on March 4, 2016; posted on the website for 41 days; sent to the 3,514 subscribers to the E-Gov Professional Services-Current Contract Opportunities mailing service. Two networking/bidders conferences were held and were attended by 40 vendors.

On April 14, 2016, 10 responses to the RFP were received. KRA Corporation was disqualified for not meeting the County's Small Local Emerging Business (SLEB) requirement. The remaining nine responses were evaluated and interviewed by a County Selection Committees (CSC) as appropriate: either for employment services or for education services. The Employment Service CSC was comprised of: one representative from the ACPD, one from the Alameda County Public Health Department, and one representative from the Oakland Community Organization. The Education Services CSC was comprised of: two representatives from the ACPD, one from Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services, and one from the City of Oakland. A maximum total of 550 evaluation points were available for this RFP. The total evaluation points include 50 preference points derived from a 5% preference for local vendors and a 5% preference for certified SLEB vendors, for a total of 10%. During the evaluation and interview stage, TriCities Community Development Center (TriCities) was disqualified for altering their bid response.

San Francisco Sheriff's Department Five Keys Charter Schools and Programs (Five Keys) was the highest scoring qualified bidder for Education services and is a non-profit that is exempt from the SLEB requirement. The Office of Acquisition Policy (OAP) has issued SLEB Waiver No. 4288 (expiring on August 1, 2018).

The following is a summary of the Education Services evaluation:

Building Opportunities for Self-Sufficiency (BOSS) and America Works of California, Inc. (America Works) were the two highest scoring qualified bidders for Employment services, and both are being recommended for award. BOSS is a certified SLEB (Principal: Donald Frazier; Location: Berkeley; Certified Small: 11-00049; Expiring on February 28, 2017). America Works has agreed to subcontract 20% to Roots Community Health Center (Roots) (Principal: Noha Aboelata, MD; Location: Oakland; Certified Small: 13-00111; Expiring on September 30, 2016).


