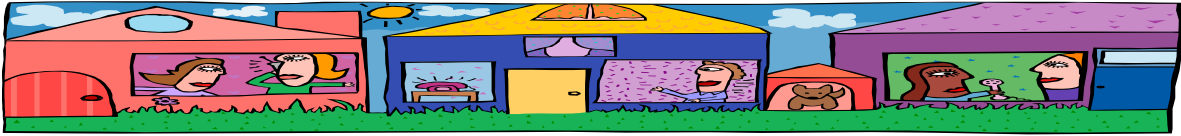


Neighborhood Crime Prevention Council Meetings



As your County Supervisor, one of my heartfelt goals is to make sure Oakland neighborhoods and communities are always recognized as vital components of the fabric of the City. Within my District, my staff and I regularly attend Neighborhood Crime Prevention Council (NCPC) meetings because they afford residents and my staff and I the opportunity to engage with other members of the neighborhood or community, the Oakland Police Department, City officials and staff on a consistent basis in order to support each other and work in sync to gain resolution to neighborhood and community issues.

Each NCPC meeting is staffed by an Oakland Police Department Community Policing Officer and a Neighborhood Services Coordinator. The role of the Community Policing Officer is to respond to crime related matters and the Neighborhood Services Coordinator's role is to assist residents with all other issues.
